

Sudden deaths in 1883.

Reckoning only the number of accidents in the first six months of 1883, in which the loss of life in each case was not less than three, it is found that nearly three thousand persons have been drowned, burned to death, killed by lightning, blown up or killed by panics, earthquakes, cyclones, landslides, snowslides, etc. Many hundreds might be added to the total by including accidents which resulted in the loss, each, of one or two lives. Classified by the months in which the accidents and losses were reported, they stand:— January, 366; February, 369; March, 423; April, 551; May, 254; June, 341;— total, 2,865. The most terrible accident recorded in the six months, was the sinking of the "Cimbria" by collision, with 388 lives. Next comes the loss of 270 lives in a town in Russian Poland, including 120 women and 60 children. At least 250 persons lost their lives by the tornado in Mississippi Georgia and South Carolina, April 27. The death of 197 children in Sunderland last month is still fresh in the public memory. By snow avalanches at Mount Ararat in March, 159 people living at the foot of the mountain were destroyed. In the same month the crews of the Hull and Yarmouth (Eng.) fishing fleets were drowned to the number of 135 persons. By the "caving in" of the Diamond coal mine, Joliet, Ill., February 17, 77 miners were suffocated. By the burning of the steamer "Gracifier" off Seymour Narrows, Pacific Coast, 70 passengers, mostly Chinese, were drowned, May 4. At the burning of the Newhall House, Milwaukee, 59 persons lost their lives. On May 18 cyclones in Illinois and Wisconsin killed 54 persons. January 20, 40 people were killed by powder explosions in a manufactory at Meriden near Amsterdam. By a similar explosion in Rome, April 6, 40 persons were killed. On March 11 the steamer "Navarre" foundered between Copenhagen and Leith, with a loss of 46 lives. On April 1, six fishing smacks went down in a gale off Yarmouth, Eng., with a loss of 40 lives. These are but a few of the 147 disasters of the six months.

Ann or Anne.

This name first appeared amongst us about 1272, but never became common until popularized by Queen Anne, of Bohemia, in 1381. Until English became the tongue usually spoken in England, or those who came can only be found in its French and Latin forms of Anne and Anna. But from 1381, downward until the accession of the House of Hanover at the earliest, the form in which we find it is always Anne. The ugly form Ann is purely the growth of that tasteless eighteenth century which also docked the finale in "Blanch" and vainly tried to evolve "Catharin." It did, alas! succeed in substituting Betsy for Bessy. The often extravagant and sometimes silly aestheticism of the present day is to some extent a rebound from the dreary ugliness of that utilitarian age. Queen Ann occasionally signed her name as Anna, but, bad speller though she was, I will venture to assert that she never perpetrated the enormity of signing Ann.

Teach the Boys to Carve.

There is probably nothing which gives greater pleasure to a certain class of people than the mere fact that their meat is cut as it ought to be. It is true that, generally speaking, too little attention is given to the subject of carving. Few gentlemen commence early enough in life to attain complete success. If it were only thought to be worth while our boys might all be taught to bone a turkey, or to slice the roast of beef or lamb with grace and perfect ease. A carving knife and fork were among the gifts at a wedding not long since, and a legend on a card accompanying it might have been quoted from Montaigne, so full of wisdom was it: "Always cut your meat the right way of the grain."
