CORSET STEELS.

With dealers the buying of corsets is largely a matter of confidence at least as far as the true quality of the boning is concerned.

In order that rusting may be guarded against each bone or steel should be covered before being placed and sewn in position in the corset. In ordinary corsets this is rarely done.

The best corsets are fully boned, the cheaper ones are only partly so. Ordinary corsets are almost invariably boned with cheap, poor quality steel and its cheapness manifests itself in brittleness. In first class corsets specially tempered, high quality spring steel is used, the better the steel the lighter the corset, for in quality is strength. DREYFUS IN PRISON.

Description of His Surroundings and Mode of Life.

PARIS, Nov. 9.—Fearing that the recent indignation over the incarceration of Captain Dreyfus might result in an attempt to rescue him, the French Government have transferred him to new quarters on Devil's Island. His former quarters were at the extreme northern end of the island, on a beach marked by a score of palm trees. This spot was thought to be too much exposed to view of passing ships, so the cabin and enclosure were removed inland about 350 yards to the crest of a commanding hill.

An artist of the Paris Illustration has just returned with several sketches and photographs of Devil's Island. These he had to make as best he could from the "dead line" drawn about the island at a distance of about 1,800 yards.

Captain Dreyfus's new cabin, enclosed in a high stockade, is about thirteen feet square, with pointed zinc roof, painted white. It stands against one side of the rectangular stockade. The stockade is about thirty-nine feet long and nineteen feet wide. It is constructed of tree trunks, pointed at the ends, and set and lashed securely together as to leave no cracks or crannies. Its height of ten feet makes it impossible for the captive to be seen either from the island or the sea. On that side of the stockade where the ground slopes sharply away the structure is reinforced by a rubble wall. In the cabin is a raised off platform very like a chicken coop, for the guard whose duty it is never to remove his eye from the prisoner. This small enclosure connects with the cabin by a door with two locks.

The night watch has the key to one of these locks, a second keeper holds the key to the other, so that the door cannot be opened safe in the presence of both. As to the furniture of the cabin, there are a small iron bedstead, a table, a dressing stand, book shelves and a little stove whereon Captain Dreyfus cooks his own food. At the end of the palisade beside the cabin is the guard house, a structure twenty-five feet square, with three windows or doors on a side. It is built to accommodate six guards. Surmounting it is a tower twenty-five feet high, on which a guard ceaselessly scans the horizon. Near him is a Hotchkiss revolving cannon, which has been fired more than once in warning.

Captain Dreyfus arises at 5 o'clock every morning. At this hour the door leading from the cabin to the enclosure is opened. After he has prepared and eaten his breakfast he walks out and smokes, striding up and down the narrow confines of his enclosure. The sky is all that he may see of the outer world. From 10 o'clock to 11 the door is closed, to be opened again from 11 o'clock to 5 in the evening. During the day Captain Dreyfus spends much time in writing, but chiefly in making architectural drawings and calculations.
