A Country Garden

beautifully shaped satin-textured flowers are either white, lilac or purple according to the variety. For the best effects in the garden, this Crocus should be grown in clumps, then the blooms not only make a splash of color at the season when other flowers are fading, but by association, give a heartening promise of spring.

Three Cyclamen bulbs were also in the parcel of Autumn flowering bulbs received, and these are also new to me. These are hardy in this country if they are planted in a well-drained place and if the snow does not stay on them a few spruce boughs should be all that is required to protect them through our winter. They are charming miniatures of the familiar Cyclamen of the greenhouse, only a few inches tall and certainly worth any care to enjoy their fairy loveliness.

This group of the Primrose family Primulaceae blooms in Autumn and the variety that I have received is C. Neapolitanum (of Naples) with silver-smeared leaves and shaded pink flowers stained with crimson. The name Cyclamen, a contraction of the Greek meaning a circle refers to the curled stem of the seed vessel. The genus was first introduced into Britain in 1569, and the quaint, distinctive flowers are found in the designs worked by Stuart and Georgian embroiderers. It is much more interesting to garden when the history of the flowers is known.

Some years ago many Madonna Lilies bloomed in this garden and always I have wanted to have more of them, so a very few have been added to my collection as they are quite expensive. They must be planted now as they grow some leaves this Fall and a sheltered sunny spot is best.

Of course all Lilies require good drainage and sand as in a base for the bulb is suggested in the garden culture of many varieties. Candidum (Madonna or St. Joseph's Lily) is a very beautiful and fragrant Lily beloved by many to be the Lily of the Bible, and all through the Middle Ages this Lily was the symbol of heavenly purity. Maeterlinck refers to this loveliest of lilies when he says "The great white Lily whose nobility dates back to that of the gods themselves." They look especially well with pale blue Larkspur or dainty pink flowers of Schizanthus.

The misty mornings, the dew-drenched lawns, and the amber haze of September, lovely days remind us that Nature's year is over and the harvest safely in. The hedgerows—splashed now with red and gold—are touched, delicately, with the gossamer of cobwebs, while in the garden the glory of the Michaelmas Daisies warns us that we have reached the crown of the year.

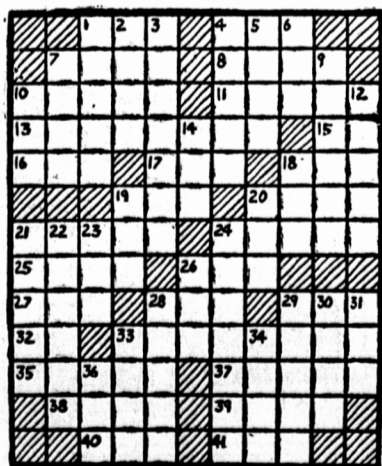
And so the seasons march. In the dark days of winter, we long for Spring. In September, we see the richness of fulfilment.
