

# Commission's Losses Tapped in S'side

**SUMMERSIDE BUREAU OF THE GUARDIAN**  
Since inauguration of provincial hospital insurance in October, 1959, the Prince County Hospital board, to the end of 1961, had to subsidize what is now substantially a government operation to the amount of \$44,000 out of its own funds. Judge Walter E. Darby, president of the board of trustees of Prince County Hospital, said in a statement made to the annual meeting of the hospital Thursday night that \$25,000 in 1961 was in excess of salary paid the individual. As a result the hospital was disallowed \$23,921 on actual salary expenditure in 1961, and denied \$18,751 on their request for 1962.

The commission claims the hospital is overpaying on drug account the extent of \$5,225 in 1961 and \$18,000 anticipated in 1962.

During the year the finance committee made representation to the town of Summerside for an increase in the \$600 yearly grant, but no decision on the matter has been made known the hospital board.

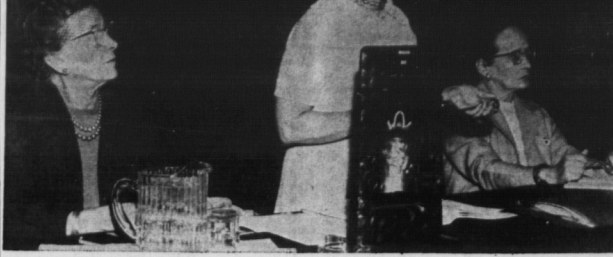
