Romanism and Secret Organizations

Rome seems to be getting aggressive recently. Of course archbishops and bishops act under instructions from Rome. Archbishop Katzer of the archdiocese of Milwaukee has made the following declaration:

1. Masons, Carbonari, Odd Fellows, Sons of Temperance, unless they have in fact left the secret society, are to be deprived of ecclesiastical burial, except in the case in which a dying man could only promise before witnesses that he would leave it.

2. Some other societies have not been declared as forbidden by name; their members, unless something else prevents it, can be buried; but we forbid their fellow members "in a body" or with badges and regalia, to be present at, or to march to or perform any rites or ceremonies at the funeral, with the exception perhaps of the union known as the Grand Army of the Republic, because this society is considered rather as a military and patriotic society. In this case even all rites and ceremonies must be excluded that are not strictly military.

All societies are implicitly excommunicated which have a religion of their own—a "priest" and a "ritual," which bind their members to observe their secrets so strictly that these cannot be revealed to the ecclesiastical authority lawfully demanding it, and which pledge their members to unreserved and blind obedience to unknown commands. The safest course for Catholics to take is to join only Catholic societies.

We quote this from the Catholic Review, a recognized organ of the Romish church in this country. The Grand Army of the Republic must feel itself complimented at the exception that is made in its favor, and yet it is not so very much of an exception after all. Protestants fortunately are not so very much frightened about these secret organizations. Said a prominent Mason and Odd Fellow to the writer of this article some time ago: "There are two mistakes made by the outside public about Masonry and Odd Fellowship. There are those who think that these societies are dangerous and do a great deal of harm; they are mistaken; they don't. Then there are those on the other hand who think they do a great deal of good. These are mistaken also; they don't."—Boston Traveller.

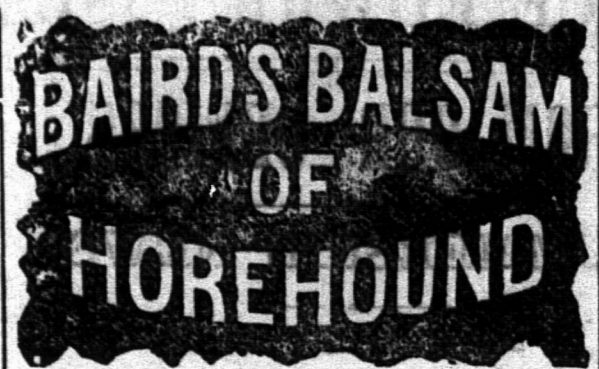

1st. Speak with your mouth about four inches from the transmitter.

2nd. Speak in a moderate tone of voice, not too loud, and distinctly.

3rd. Place the Telephone so as to cover the Ear, just as if you wished to shut out all other sounds. Do not press too hard on the Ear.

It is possible to talk and be heard when standing back two or three feet from the transmitter, if you shout loud enough, but it is not a pleasant mode of conversation, and is entirely unnecessary, and is a useless waste of wind and lungs, besides being very annoying to all within range of your voice.
