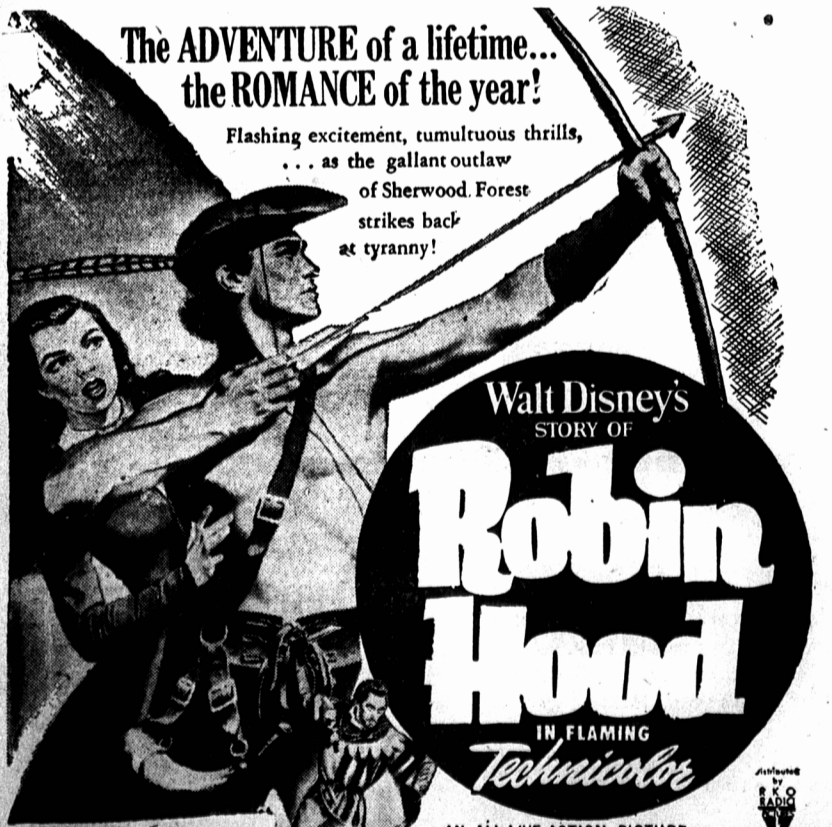

Smith, said the MIGs jumped them while they were on a routine patrol from seven to 10 miles inside the West German frontier, crippled Brown's plane so he had to bail out and then vanished only about 2 1/2 minutes after they were first sighted.

No Chance To Return Fire
Both veterans of Korean air warfare, Brown and Smith never fired a shot. Their planes lack the manoeuvrability of the swift, fast-climbing MIGs.

The only reason Brown and Smith did not return fire was that they didn't get an opportunity because the intruders vanished so quickly after the shooting, the spokesman said.
Under standing orders, he said, U. S. Air Force planes intercepting alien craft on American-controlled territory are to lead them to an American landing field and to enforce their landing orders with gunfire if they resist.
