**The Frenchman's Fullet.**

Prof. Mathieu Williams has shown to our readers in a very practical manner how old fowls may be served as a tender roast by stewing gently for several hours, allowing them to remain in the water in which they were cooked over night, then to be taken out and roasted as ordinary young chicken. This is for fowls of three or four years old. When the fowl is a year old the French have another way, which is also very successful, and as age improves the flavour of chickens and at the same time makes them much lower in price, the housewife does well to turn her attention from broilers to "chickens of a larger growth." The yearling is to be properly skinned and stuffed, wrapped in a double thickness of soft paper, well secured, and half an hour longer allowed for the cooking on account of the wrapping. After cooking for three-quarters of an hour the paper is to be removed and the uncovered chicken basted and browned for half an hour longer.
