

The Horrors of Prison Life.

The Grand Jury of Hinds Co., Miss., embraces the following in its report in reference to the convicts in the Mississippi Penitentiary.

"We found twenty-six inmates, all of whom have been lately brought there off the farms and railroads, many of them with consumption and other incurable diseases, and all bearing on their persons marks of most inhuman and brutal treatment.

The leases as individuals are not condemned, but the system and principle which permits the State to take a poor creature's liberty away and turn him over to those whose interest is to coin his blood into money are strongly inveighed against.

American Affairs.

The Boston Journal remarks:—"If the \$29,000,000 worth of cotton goods, the \$48,000,000 worth of iron, and the \$45,000,000 worth of woolen products which were imported into this country during the last fiscal year had been sold elsewhere for the most part, we should have had occasion to build more factories to supply the home demand.

Railway rates on the Pacific section of the inter-oceanic railway are reported to have been largely reduced. This, as was pointed out before, is the one remedy open to the people of Manitoba and the Northwest. The concession is timely, and it may be taken as proof that the rates reduced were excessive.

Remark upon the absence of trouble this summer on the fishery question, the New York Times says:—"The natural conclusion seems to be that there has been no trouble thus far this season, because the American fishermen have, themselves, avoided it. Trouble is not profitable to them, and profit is mainly what they seek."
