## Compulsory Medical Exam For Motorists Advocated

MONTREAL (CP)—Motorists should be forced to submit to medical examinations, including strict eye tests, every three years, says Dr. Leon Brody, director of New York University's safety education centre.

Dr. Brody and other scientists at an international conference here said experiments have shown conclusively that even a minor eye deficiency can play a major role in traffic accidents.

Dr. Gordon H. E. Kelly, ophthalmology lecturer at University of Toronto, told the conference—considering medical aspects of traffic accidents—that regulations regarding eyesight vary widely from province to province in Canada. In general, there was no eye test and motorists could obtain licences without any clinical examination.

Dr. Brody urged adoption of a system of medical examination for

all driving licence applicants, incorporating an eye test. This would be assisted by a program of staggered, rather than obliging all drivers to apply for new licences at a particular time of year.

The scientist added: "Incidentally, at the present time there is considerable variation in requirements among the different provinces of Canada, as Dr. Kelly has clearly indicated, and also among the states of the U.S. These could well be unified."

## VOTERS' QUALIFICATIONS

IN ORDER THAT EACH DULY QUALIFIED VOTER MAY EXERCISE HIS FRANCHISE, THE P. E. I. LIBERAL ASS'N. WISH TO BRING THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION TO YOUR ATTENTION BEFORE ELECTION DAY.

### WHO MAY VOTE

1. The voter must be a Canadian citizen
2. Must be 21 years of age or over.
3. It is not necessary that your name appear on any voters' list.

## TO VOTE FOR COUNCILLOR

The voter must

1. Either have a \$325 interest in land or be married to a husband or wife who has;

OR

2. Be a veteran, male or female, of the Canadian Armed Forces which include Army, Navy, Airforce, or the Auxiliary Services; Merchant Marine, Red Cross, Canadian Fire Fighters. Veterans need not be over twenty-one years of age.

Veteran must have served outside Canada (this includes World War II veterans who served in Newfoundland).

OR

3. Be an ordained clergyman, having actual charge of a Parish.

NOTE: The wife or husband of a veteran or the wife of a clergyman has no vote for Councillor unless there is property.

No person has a Councillor vote on rented land if the rent he pays is a fair rental value. However, if the tenant has increased the value of such land to the extent of \$325 he is entitled to vote for Councillor. This would include persons who have built summer cottages on leased land.

HAVING ANY OF THE ABOVE QUALIFICATIONS YOU MAY VOTE FOR YOUR LIBERAL COUNCILLOR CANDIDATE.

## TO VOTE FOR ASSEMBLYMAN

The voter must:

1. Have lived in the Province for at least twelve months and in the electoral district where he seeks to vote, since February 27th, 1955. Time spent as a mariner, fisherman, student or as a member of any of the Armed Services shall be considered for the purpose of voting as having been spent in the district in which his residence would have been except for such absence;

OR

2. Either own land worth \$100 or be married to someone who does;

OR

3. Occupy or have for his own use, any building worth \$100 on land he does not own in which case such land or building must have been occupied by the voter for six months;

OR

4. Anyone who has a vote for Councillor has also a vote for Assemblyman regardless of residence qualifications.

HAVING ANY OF THE ABOVE QUALIFICATIONS YOU MAY VOTE FOR YOUR LIBERAL ASSEMBLYMAN CANDIDATE.

## WHERE TO VOTE

Where an elector has a Property Vote, he may vote in the district in which such property is situated and the owner (or wife or husband) may vote for both Councillor and Assemblyman in such district regardless of whether they have lived in the district or not.

An elector may vote in each Electoral District in which he owns property. A person might own property in Charlottetown and Rocky Point. In such case the elector could vote for B. Earle MacDonald and Alex MacIsaac in the Fifth District, and J. J. Mustard and George Kitson in the Second District).

Where an elector has only a vote for Assemblyman he votes in the Polling Division where he lives.
