Information Denied

As a result of the persistent demands of the Opposition there were brought down yesterday the report of the Stock Farm Commissioners, the report of the Hospital for the Insane, and the Supervisors' returns and estimates.

But a number of returns are, even yet, wanting. Among these are the amount of the accounts carried over from 1892 into 1893; the amount given away as discounts at the Land Office; the cost of operating the road making machine; and the expenditure of the Government in the first three months of the present year.

The Same Old Gerrymander.

It was expected that the same influence which caused the withdrawal of the Mortgage Vote would operate to prevent the revival of the villainous gerrymander of King's County.

There has not, during the present session, been a more decided hit than that which was made yesterday by the Hon. Daniel Gordon, when he compared the robber-tyrant Procrustes with the Peters Combination.

Jogging His Memory!

The Leader of the Opposition has given notice that he will ask the Leader of the Government whether or not it is his intention to pass, at the present session of the Legislature, an act to repeal the Disfranchisement Act.

SUMMARY OF PROCEEDINGS.

FRIDAY, April 14.

At half-past three the debate on the motion to adopt the report of the committee on the Gerrymander Bill three months hence was resumed by Mr. Underhay, who pointed out, among other things, that the evident object of the bill was to "divide" certain classes of voters in certain districts.

Dr. Jenkins thought the object of the bill was good, as its aim was to give more equal representation. In his opinion, however, the step proposed was a short and a very crooked one.

Hon. Mr. Peters said he had spoken on this subject before, and would not say very much now. The object of the bill was to provide for a more equal representation, and if the proposal made did not suit the Opposition they should have suggested something better.

Mr. Shaw pointed out that last year the people thought that because the amalgamation-mortgage-vote-disfranchisement gerrymander bill was not assented to there would be an end of it, and, in consequence, no public meetings were held throughout the country last year.

Mr. Bell said he had no objection to the people expressing their opinion upon certain matters. He claimed, however, that the late government attempted to pass an amalgamation bill similar to that which we are now passing, without the authority of the people.

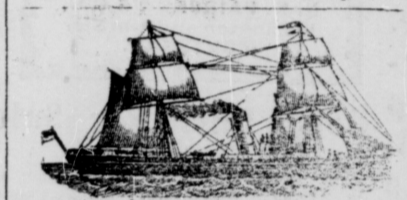
