KENYA JAILS 24

NAIROBI (AP) — Twenty-four Africans who last July attempted to take over the headquarters of the ruling Kenya African National Union were sent to prison for from 12 to 18 months by a Nairobi magistrate Tuesday. They were convicted of forcible entry, causing a breach of the peace, unlawful assembly and trespass, in what the prosecutor described as a "deliberately and carefully planned attempt to take over by force the organization of the governing political party of the state."

Brewery Firm's Profits Down

TORONTO (CP) — Canadian Breweries Ltd. had net earnings of \$3,611,685 or 13.8 cents a share in the third quarter ended July 31, compared with \$5,352,703 or 21.8 cents in the same period last year. For the nine months ending July 31, earnings were \$7,945,565 or 28.1 cents a share, against \$11,368,085 or 43.8 cents in the same period of 1964. Nine-month sales totalled \$300,447,946, down from \$307,601,576 last year. Third quarter sales were down to \$119,292,298 from \$124,882,191. E. P. Taylor, chairman, said the trend of consolidated sales and profits continued to be unsatisfactory. Canadian sales are ahead of last year, but volume in the United States is down about 10 per cent. Profits in Canada were higher, but the company's U.S. subsidiary took a loss for the first time in many years because of lower sales. Mr. Taylor said senior management had been reorganized and new policies instituted. "Any important improvement in the company's affairs should not be anticipated in the short-term future," Mr. Taylor and President J. G. Campbell said.

JOEY WELCOMES PEARSON ON BLUSTERY DAY IN NFLD.

By DAVE MCINTOSH ST. JOHN'S, Nfld. (CP)—Premier Smallwood turned on the political warmth for Prime Minister Pearson's arrival in Newfoundland, Thursday on a blustery day during which snow fell. The only jarring note for Mr. Pearson were two placards carried by bearded youths at the airport which read "Frogs shall overcome" and "Give Churchill Falls to Quebec." The youths also carried a French tricolor. Mr. Smallwood personally organized the moorcade from the airport into the city. He grabbed a loud-hailer and roared "all aboard your cars. Come on. Come on now." The premier complained later on a downtown platform in front of the railway station that the "magnificently efficient" RCMP had split the moorcade into 17 pieces. He added that the RCMP was a federal organization. Mr. Pearson said he was glad Mr. Smallwood admitted there was something in Newfoundland not under provincial jurisdiction. Mr. Pearson said he was bursting in the crowd shouting, "How about eight this time?" Mr. Pearson said he wants Parliament to return to the "old tradition" of the government party having a majority. The government still had a lot of things it wanted to get done. He said St. John's is bursting at the seams — which showed what good government could do federally and provincially.

Airline Bids For New Route

VANCOUVER (CP) — Canadian Pacific Airlines says Canada's competitive position in air transportation will be improved by the granting of a new route to CPA. A spokesman for the airline said Wednesday the route between Toronto, Montreal and Amsterdam will also provide a new trade and friendship link between Canada and The Netherlands. The federal Air Transport Board announced approval of the new route earlier Wednesday. Previously CPA aircraft were permitted to fly to The Netherlands only from Western Canada. The spokesman said the company plans to inaugurate the new service Nov. 2, operating initially between Montreal and Amsterdam. There would be two return flights weekly, leaving Montreal Tuesdays and Fridays and returning from Amsterdam Wednesdays and Saturdays.

Firm's Collapse Investigated

TORONTO (CP) — About 60 firms are being examined in connection with the royal commission investigation of the collapse of Atlantic Acceptance Corp., Mr. Justice Samuel Hughes of the Supreme Court of Ontario said Thursday. Mr. Justice Hughes, the commissioner appointed six weeks ago, said about 30 chartered accountants will be retained by the commission to help sort out the tangled business affairs of Atlantic, its subsidiaries and companies associated with it. Public hearings are expected to start in January. They will last most of the year, officials indicated. Atlantic went into receivership June 16 after failing to meet some short-term debts.

Parents Barred From Mute Son

MIAMI, Fla. (AP)—A juvenile judge committed Ricky Thorne of Detroit to a special school here for care and treatment and decreed Wednesday that his parents could not see him for a year unless psychiatrists approve. His mother admitted she abandoned the mute, mentally retarded 13-year-old boy in Miami, 1,350 miles from home. Mrs. Maxine Thorne of Troy, Mich., a 44-year-old, red-haired housewife, said she had cared for Ricky alone since an illness damaged his brain when he was 18 months old. "He had not progressed recently, perhaps even progressed a little," she said. "But he was becoming a man and getting new problems." She said she left Ricky in the Miami airport with the labels clipped from his clothes and only three cents in his pockets because she had despaired of getting help in Michigan. Judge Sheppard dismissed neglect charges against her, but ordered her to undergo psychiatric treatment. The judge praised newspapers, radio and TV stations for their stories about Ricky, who was not identified for five days after he was noticed sitting alone in the airport. The Thorne's face charges of neglect in Michigan, but authorities there indicated they were filed against the possibility Ricky's case would be referred back to that state. A condition of Ricky's enrollment in the Miami school is that his parents bear the expense.

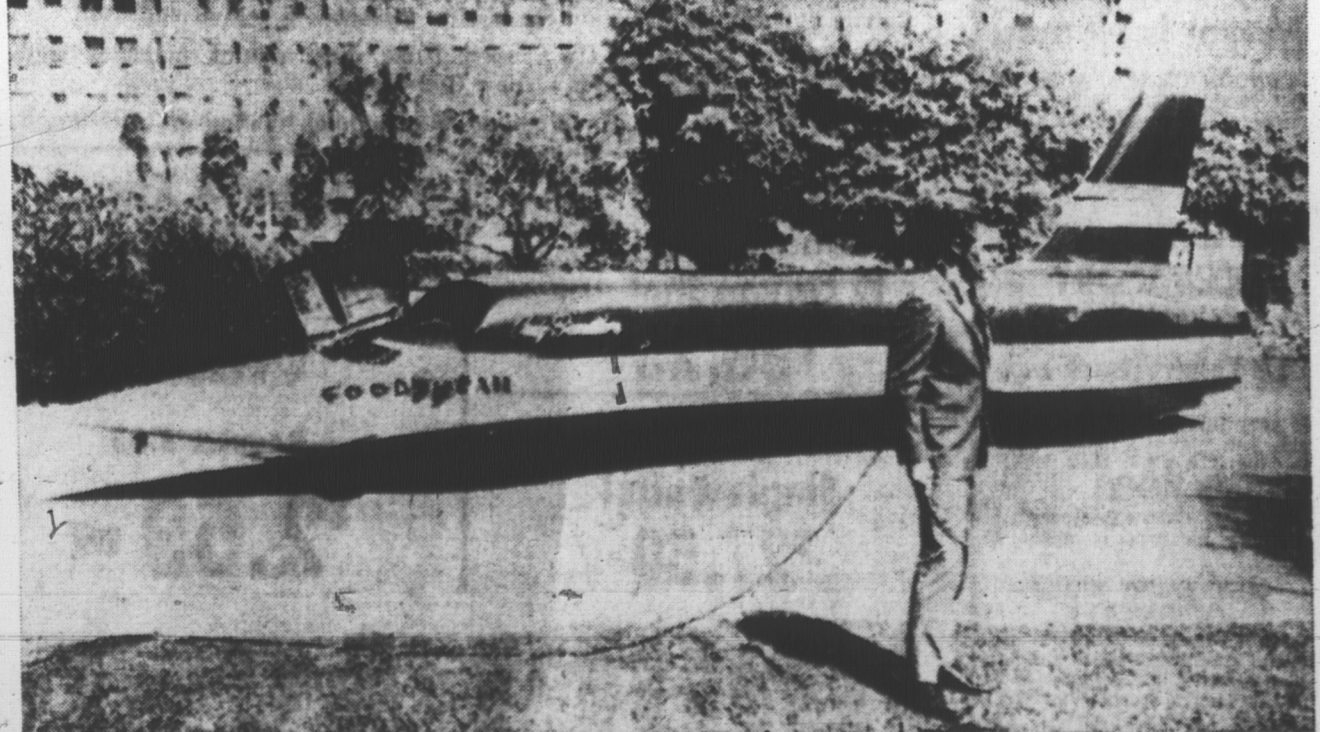
