JOCKEY MAKES DIFFERENCE

BALTIMORE (AP) - Those horse racing fans who know what jockey Eddie Arcaro has done in the Preakness stakes in the past are taking another look at First Landing, the mount he is to ride in the 83rd running of the Preakness at Pimlico Saturday. The track oddsmaker has listed the Brookmeade Stable's Sword Dancer, who was nosed out by Tony Lee in the Kentucky Derby, as the probable Preakness favorite at 2-to-1 odds. Bob Sloan, the mutuels manager, made First Landing-third in the derby—the second choice here at 3 to 1. Arcaro is the winningest Preakness jockey with six triumphs. The Master has ridden in Baltimore's triple crown classic 14 times and has been in the money on 12 occasions. He hasn't been worse than third since 1944, with 11 mounts. Pimlico railbirds, who were chased under the stands Wednesday by another thunderstorm that left the track resembling nearby Chesapeake Bay, look back no farther than 1957 for an Arcaro coup. As the derby favorite, Bold Ruler with Arcaro up finished fourth in Louisville behind Iron Liege. But two weeks later in the Preakness, Bold Ruler was sent into the front end at once and beat Iron Liege by two lengths. Tony Lee has shuffled back to California after his duel with Sword Dancer in the derby. Willie Shoemaker, who rode Tony Lee, replaces Bill Boland as Sword Dancer's rider. Willie and Eddie are the greatest of friends, but that will be forgotten when the gates spring open for an expected field of 12 three-year-olds at 6:45 p.m. ADT, Saturday, with Eddie and Willie thinking about the \$137,700 net for the winner.

Spahn Scores 250th Victory

St. LOUIS (AP) - Warren Spahn, Milwaukee's matchless veteran Wednesday night wrapped up the 250th victory of his major league career—a mark reached by only two other National League lefthanders—with a seven-hit 3-2 conquest of the St. Louis Cardinals. The 36-year-old Spahn became a winner on Billy Bruttin's eight-inning homer after a tough duel with Larry Jackson, who gave the Braves only six hits. The victory evens his season record at 4-4. Eppa Rixey (266) and Carl Hubbell (253) were the only other National League lefthanders to win 250. Spahn is the 25th pitcher in major league history to reach the mark, the 16th since the turn of the century. Spahn was shaky in the first two innings, then settled down to stop the Cardinals in his usual brilliant fashion.

Basilio Receives Word About Proposed Bout

SYRACUSE, N.Y. (AP)—Carmen Basilio's camp disclosed Wednesday the fighter has received his first word from Ray Robinson about a proposed Sept. 21 fight for the middleweight championship. Basilio also has received an offer from New Jersey promoter Willie Gilzenberg for a fight with Robinson in Newark or Jersey City this summer. John DeJohn, Basilio's co-manager, said Basilio received a telegram from Samuel Rose, Philadelphia city councilman who hopes to promote the fight in Philadelphia's 100,000-seat Municipal Stadium. Robinson said he will wait to see what the New York State Athletic Commission does Friday. That is the deadline for Robinson to sign for a Basilio fight or lose his title in New York. The NBA already has vacated Robinson's title but has indicated it will reinstate Robinson if Basilio is agreeable to the Sept. 21 fight. DeJohn declined to say whether he is giving serious consideration to Gilzenberg's offer.

Ernie Banks' grand slam homer in a seven-run third inning backed Glen Hobbie's three-hit pitching for a 10-0 Chicago Cub victory over Cincinnati Reds Wednesday. The game was one of two afternoon contests in the National League. In the other, righthander Sam Jones shut out Philadelphia Phillies on two hits as San Francisco whipped the Phillies 6-0. Jones struck out 12, the most by a National League pitcher this season. In the American League's only game, Chicago White Sox shut out Boston Red Sox 3-0. Three other scheduled contests—Cleveland at New York, Kansas City at Baltimore and Detroit at Washington—were rained out. Milwaukee was at St. Louis and Pittsburgh at Los Angeles in night National League games.
