SHORTER DAY, SAME PAY

Thomas G. Plant Co Reduces Working Hours.

The Thomas G. Plant company, manufacturers of the famous "Queen Quality" shoes, running the largest factory in the world of women's fine shoes, has reduced the working day of its 2000 employees to eight hours a day.

Two years ago the Plant Company, with a pay roll of \$1,000,000 per annum, decided to adopt the nine-hour system. They believed that, under proper conditions, their factory could produce as many shoes with the nine-hour system as with the usual 10-hour shoe factory day. By adopting special methods in keeping the employed, requiring promptness in attendance, the new departure was made a success in results, and recently it was decided to still further reduce the hours to eight instead of nine.

This is the result of a perfect system in supervising every detail of an immense business. Today the Thomas G. Plant company enjoys the unique distinction of having voluntarily put into effect an eight-hour system without any change at all being made in the wages of their week hands, which is one-fifth of their total force employed; and, further, the company claims that under conditions now enforced, the piece work help can earn as much in the eight-hour day as they formerly earned in the ten-hour day.

Quotation from a prominent labor official:

"Remember that that whether you work by the piece or work by the day, "Reducing the hours, increases the pay."

There are separate entrances for male and female employees, with three elevators to carry the latter to their respective floors. Hat and coat lockers are provided for all. Water boys are constantly in attendance to supply fresh drinking water to those who want it.

Within the factory sanitary arrangements are as perfect as possible and the system of ventilation is perfect. During the months when the windows are necessarily kept closed there are 24 large ventilating fans kept running to exhaust the impure air, which is replaced by pure air from an immense blower.

Under such conditions it is not surprising to find efficiency, harmony and earnings per capita averaging higher than any other and less advantageously planned and conducted establishments.

It is the company's belief that when a dispute is verging on a strike, the principals involved are not competent to decide fairly which side is right—it is only the impartial third party that can do so. To carry this belief into effect the Plant company has bound itself by a signed statement with each employee, whereby any grievance not satisfactorily adjusted between the employers and the firm shall be submitted to the state board of arbitration and conciliation, whose decision shall be final and binding to both.

The magnitude and completeness of this establishment and its business is marvelous when it is remembered that it is only a growth of 10 years. Five years ago this business was moved from Lynn to Boston in the face of predicted failure, but the results—the business has been tripled—have proved that Boston has exceptional advantages for manufacturers.
