Two Weeks Of Evangelistic Services Concluded Sunday

Two weeks evangelistic services concluded last night at the Rollaway when another large crowd of citizens enjoyed the singing of Evangelist Bill Miller of Truro, N.S., better known as Uncle Bill, and the showing of a film on the subject of "The Unpardonable Sin."

The film was made available by Evangelist Clyde Collins of Halifax and was both thought

provoking and educational from a spiritual standpoint.

With Rev. Victor Jackson, the two Evangelists have been conducting services at Calvary Temple in Parkdale and Saturday morning a special rally was held at the Rollaway with a turnout of over four hundred young people. The special film shown during Saturday morning's service was entitled "That Kid Buck," a feature on juvenile delinquency.

Wrecked Mystery Boat Is Found On Kings Co. Shore

A mystery boat of unknown ownership, was found several days ago, completely broken up and tossed on the rocks, apparently by high seas at Brown's Cape.

Discovered by two fishermen, Mr. Ed Tossel and Mr. Reg Banks, the boat was approximately 25 feet in length 10 feet in width and thought to be a shallow draught, scow-type boat. It housed a 150 h.p. Chrysler Marine engine. The bow of the boat can not be located on the rocky, wreck-strewn shore.

It is thought the boat may have broken away from morning at a Gulf port and that the wreckage was on the shore at Brown's Cape for some time.

Report Damage To Lobster Gear

A strong north west wind which started Friday and continued through Saturday, caused considerable damage to lobster traps and ropes in the area from Neufrese to North Lake.

It is reported that approximately 60 percent of traps and lines were lost or damaged. The gear is fished by some 218 boats which average 500 traps per boat. Fortunately some fishermen did not have all their traps set.

One fisherman reported on returning from his traps over the weekend that a dog trawl with twenty traps had nothing more than two badly broken traps remaining.

Move Head For U. C. Ministry

TORONTO (CP) — More candidates are studying for the ministry in United Church of Canada colleges and schools today than at any time since church union in 1925, the Church Board of Colleges was told Wednesday.

Dr. Harold Young, board secretary, said more than 700 young men and women now are in courses leading to the ministry. There were 186 new enrolments this year.

The 21 United Church educational institutions across Canada now have 10,402 students and building assets worth \$26,500,000. Almost \$5,000,000 will be spent this year on operating costs.

The board made grants of \$60,000 to aid students in studying for the ministry.

Students End Siege After 37th Try To See Duplessis

QUEBEC (CP)—Three "universities of Montreal students, refused an interview with Premier Duplessis for the 37th time Thursday, announced they are suspending their "siege" at the Quebec legislature buildings to take their university examinations and to seek summer employment.

As they departed they said they will be back at Mr. Duplessis' office door in September.

The trio, sustained by \$110 weekly contributions from fellow students, said they were bowing to a decision of the committee of presidents of the student associations of the province's universities.

The committee, in a prepared statement, expressed its "profound admiration" for the trio, described as "ill-mannered children" by Mr. Duplessis on two occasions.

CRITICIZE DUPLESSIS The committee said the premier's conduct was "wanting in the elementary rules of citizenship and civility" in refusing the three students an interview every week day since March 7. It added the students were turned back often enough to show "the obstinacy of the premier in his anti-democratic decisions."

Bruno Meloche, 23, Jean-Pierre Goyer, 26, and Francine Laurendeau, 21, had no inkling their effort to see Mr. Duplessis would arouse widespread attention and spark the organization of public meetings during the summer months.

One was held last weekend and several are planned. The student associations say they will undertake a public campaign to make their financial problems known to the public. The students have received mail from labor unions, priests, professors, college students, various social groups, and plain citizens.
