Rio Grande, a surprise win in the seventh race, established a new record going in 2:13.15. The best time of the evening 2:09.13 Victory Scott (C. Smith) was set by Speaker's Pick in the second race, and Post Hanover in both the fourth and eighth races.

John Benham was the physical educator handling Sherwood and Bryce Boswell was in charge of the winning Parkdale boys.

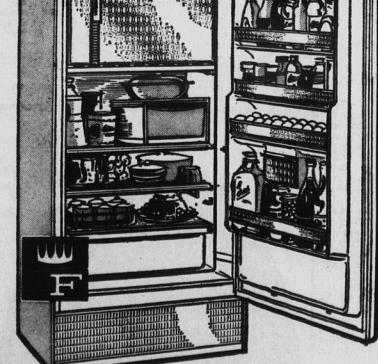

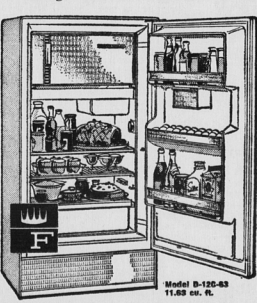

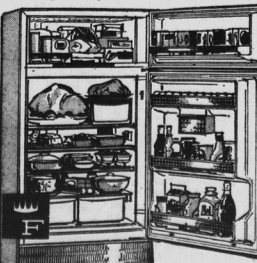
