

British Outlook On Sports s Changed Considerably

LONDON (CP)—The prospect of a British trainer continuing to dominate English racing and honors over bribery and vendictive in soccer cast a shadow over the British sports scene as it heads into 1965. There's consolation in a British driver's triumph in world auto racing and in the fact that the British team made its best showing at the Olympics. But an average 1964 has been a less-than-satisfactory year and the outlook for the new year isn't much better.

Roughness generally associated with soccer as played on the Continent spread to Britain. It resulted in a record number of players being sent off for foul play during the 1964-65 season. October when a Leeds United-Everton game was halted for 10 minutes to let players and fans cool down, an unprecedented incident in English league history.

Combined with earlier revulsion of bribes being accepted by more than a dozen players, it brought a howl from the press

which blamed the new bonus system for the win-at-any-cost mentality that has put pressure on players and managers.

British Railways have cancelled some special football trains because of vandalism among fans, and extra police have been assigned to control spectators at such fields.

PADDY ON TOP
 The French Goltschek ski jump has a bleak prospect in 1965 as far as English horses are concerned. Ireland's impressive P. J. (Paddy) Prendergast dominated proceedings in 1964, and seems to hold all the high cards for the 1965 classic races, so much so that some bookmakers are offering no more than 4 to 1 against a Prendergast-trained horse winning the Epsom Derby next June.

Prendergast, listed as an overseas trainer, headed the stakes-winning list in Britain in 1964 with a ratings totalling £138,000. Only one other foreign trainer has topped the British list since 1952—France's Charlie Semblat in 1959.

Prendergast saddled the third, fourth and sixth horses in the last Derby, won by Santa Claus, and his candidates for the next include Meadow Court, owned by Max Bell of Calgary.

Another possible Canadian-owned Derby candidate is Nebebe, owned by E. P. Taylor of Toronto who shipped seven British yearlings to Canada in October to replenish his Windfields stud.

In motor racing, Britain retained the world championship with John Surtees, former world motorcycle champ, displacing countryman Jim Clark. Surtees, driving a Ferrari, gave Italy the manufacturers' award held the previous year by British Lotus.

Philadelphia Obtains Bo

HOUSTON (AP) — Bo Belinsky, the controversial left-handed pitcher, was traded Friday by Los Angeles Angels to Philadelphia Phillies for rookie first baseman Costen Shockley and pitcher Rudy May.

Belinsky was placed on baseball's disqualified list last summer after he failed to report to the Angels' Hawaii farm.

He had been suspended by the Angels after an altercation with a Los Angeles sports writer Aug. 14.

Belinsky wound up with a 9-8 record last season and a 2.87 earned run average. His high mark was 10-11 in 1963, his rookie year, when he pitched a

Shockley, 22, led the Pacific Coast League with 36 home runs at Arkansas last season and tied for the lead with 112 runs batted in. He batted .281. May, a 28-year-old left-hander, had a 4-2 record at Indianapolis in the PCL last year before he was purchased by the Phillies.
