ST. PATRICK'S HALL.—Monday night week.

FAT CATTLE.—On Thursday last Mr. C. A. McNutt, Kensington shipped from here to Messrs. J. A. Leaman & Co., Halifax, a car load of fat cattle, twenty-two in number. They were a very good lot. —Sunnerside Journal.

GOLD DISCOVERY.—According to an exchange a rich vein of gold has been found in Halifax. The lead is surrounded by granite and is at a depth of about 49 feet. In width it runs from eight to eighteen inches and is encased in slate outside of which is solid granite.

DRILLING FOR THE JUBILEE.—The pupils of the city schools are being prepared for their part they are to take in the Jubilee celebration. They had their first drill yesterday afternoon on the grounds of Upper Prince Street School. The drill will be continued each Friday afternoon until the Jubilee.

SOUSA AND HIS BAND will be heard here in a grand concert on Monday evening June 7th at the Exhibition Building. But a few weeks ago the distinguished conductor assumed the personal management of his famous organization and this will be his first appearance in this city since his accession to his new dignities. His great band was never in as fine form as at present and the Sousa instrumentalists respond in perfect accord with the mind of the master musician in control. The programme for this concert will include some of the most beautiful and substantial music of the times, and the audience can rely upon a large instalment of the most inspiring music of modern times—the famous Sousa marches. The soloists with "Sousa and his Band" are Elizabeth Northrop Soprano; Martina Johnstone, Violinist; Arthur Pryor, trombone; and Franz Hell; Flugel-horn.

PERSONALITIES.

The late Edwin L. Barney of New Bedford, Mass., was for some years a law partner of General B. F. Butler.

Walter Drake of Montreal has given \$25,000 to McGill university as an endowment for the chair of physiology.

To celebrate his silver wedding, the Marquis of Bute has given \$5,000 to the town of Cardiff, the income to be given to poor girls who need the money to get married.

Willis Van Devanter, the new assistant attorney general for the interior department, is a successful lawyer and is 38 years old. He is a native of Indiana and a graduate of De Pauw university.

Governor Lowndes of Maryland admits that as a farmer he has been a complete failure. Unlike most unsuccessful farmers, he says it was not the fault of the farm, but because he doesn't understand the business.

Baron de Coubertin, who was active in the revival of the new Olympian games, has started a society in Paris whose object is to spread the knowledge of French civilization and of French work in scholarship and science in the United States.

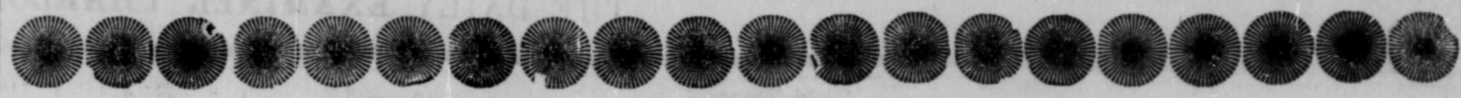

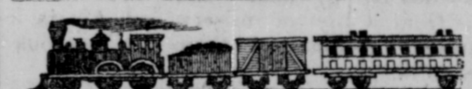
