The organizers of Expo '67 have set up a \$5,000 prize for a hit song about the world's fair.

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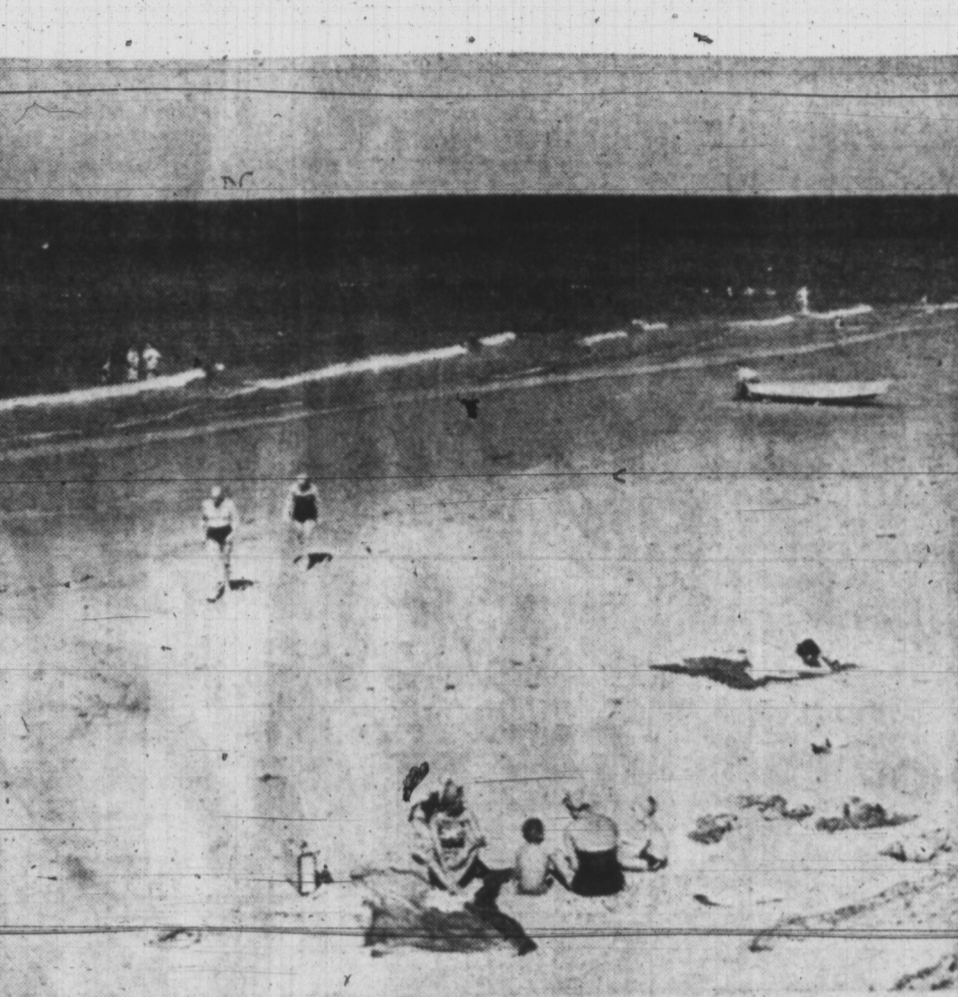
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
