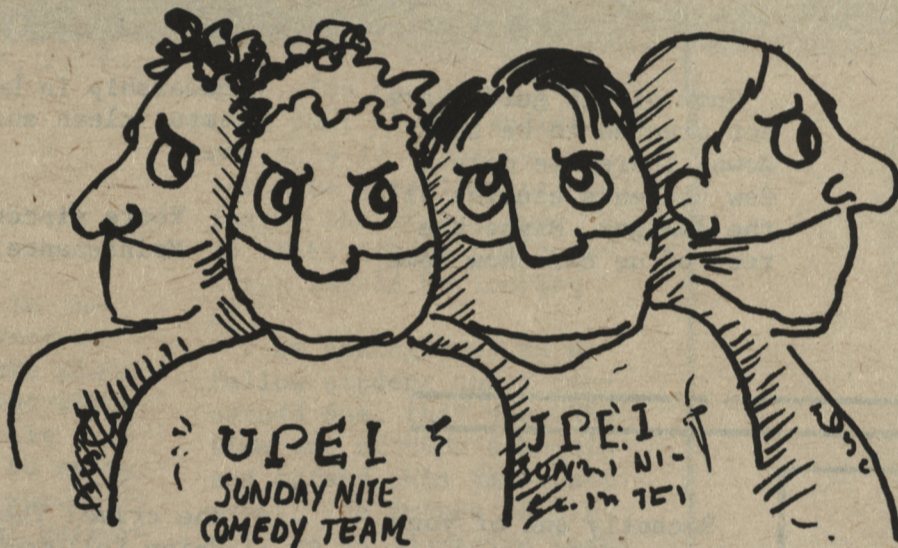

Student Union General Meeting

The general Fall meeting of the U.P.E.I.S.U. was held Sunday, September 29th, 1974 at 7:05 P.M. in Duffy Amphitheater.

Out of 1400 students at U.P.E.I., approximately 10% or 40 students showed for this important meeting. (the 10% includes the Student Union Members). Perhaps the apathy of the students can be put down to the time at which the meeting was scheduled for. Mass starts at 6:30 and ends at 7:30 P.M. If you are inclined towards going to Mass at the Univ-

ersity, then it is virtually impossible to attend these Student Union meetings. Also worth mentioning is the amount of the student population that retire to the country for the week-end and do not return until late Sunday night. With the competition so high-no wonder there was such little turn out.

It has been decided that the Committee heads be installed in office from May to May instead of from February to February. This is hoped to alleviate the problems which ensue from changing staff half way through the term.

Last year the Students were covered under Zurich Insurance but the Student Union feels that Blue Cross covers the Students more effectively, so it has

been adopted as the University Insurance.

The Student Union is also trying to obtain a permanent liquor licence, set up a Progress Fund for a new Student Union Building (which is desperately needed), and have passed a bill which will require part-time students to pay a small token fee. Part time students now have access to activities at the University. With this bill it is hoped that some of the financial burden will fall from the full-time students. This bill must be passed by the board of governors first.

There was no treasury report because of the change in staff heads. It is hoped that the financial report will be out next week!

Committee heads have now become on par with the rest of the student body. No longer will they be allowed to get into activities at U.P.E.I. free. At Pig & Whistles they must now pay the same price instead of getting their beer at cost price.
