CHERRY VALLEY.—Rev. John T. Bryan will preach at Cherry Valley Church on Sunday afternoon next, the 11th, inst at 3 p. m.

THE BISLEY TEAM.—The Canadian Bisley team will parade in Montreal on the 23rd of June and will sail on the morning of the 24th by the Allan liner Tainui. Prince Edward Island will be represented by Sergt. Weatherbie.

A SENSIBLE SUGGESTION.—The St. John exhibition should be liberally advertised in P. E. Island at the earliest possible date. There is a big patronage to be got from the Island if it is looked after at once. The Halifax exhibition management is talking of putting a resident agent on the Island to work up business.—St. John Sun.

THAT SETTLED HIM.—Dr. Thomas G. Addison, suffering from the effects of the opium habit, when brought before the court at Washington for commitment to an insane asylum, seemed rational enough, but asked to be allowed to read an original poem. He read twenty verses when the judge stopped him and sent him to the asylum.

BOSTON KNIGHTS OF PYTHIAS.—The Knights of Pythias, of Boston and vicinity, are arranging a tour through the Maritime Provinces in August. It is expected that about 600 Knights will take the trip. They propose crossing to Yarmouth, taking a run through Nova Scotia and P. E. Island and will stop in Moncton a day and a night on their way through New Brunswick.

OMEGA AT HALIFAX.—The Halifax Herald says: The schooner Omega, bound from Charlottetown to Demerara, and reported in for shelter, came here to go on the marine railway to paint. Captain Murckeson, who is in command of the vessel, was chief officer of the steamer Stanley for 13 years. The vessel came off the slip this morning and cleared for Demerara.

COWS IN IRELAND.—Last year there were in Ireland 1,434,925 milch cows—an increase of a little over 5000 on the total of the previous year. The number of cows kept for dairy purposes in that country has been comparatively constant during the past forty years, the highest at any time during the period being 1,690,000, in 1859, and the lowest, 1,348,003 in 1864. The average for the period named was about 1,450,000.

MANITOBA CROPS.—Word comes from Winnipeg that the crops in the Northwest are doing well. It is said that wheat is for the most part up four inches above the ground, and owing to the very favorable weather it is expected the crops on July 1 will be as far advanced as on the same day last year. Barley and oat seeding is nearly completed. The acreage under wheat is slightly increased over last year while there is considerable increase in the acreage sown to barley and oats.

WISER THAN WHISKEY.—At the National Conference of Charities and Corrections held in Cincinnati, Ohio, recently, Superintendent George Torrence, of the Illinois State Reformatory, on the subject: "The Relation of Cigarette to Crime," used the following very startling language: "The use of cigarettes by boys under 15 years of age sent to the Reformatory, was almost universal. I am sure that cigarettes are destroying and making criminals of more boys than saloons. On May 1st, 92 per cent. of the boys between 10 and 15 in the institution were cigarette smokers, and 85 per cent. were cigarette fiends." He declared that the cigarette "attacked the nervous system, weakened the will power and destroyed the ability to resist criminal impulses; the depression following the use, was worse than that produced by alcohol; its effect was like that of morphine or cocaine. The use of the cigarette was 10 fold worse than that of intoxicating liquors."

Zola's Truth

PARIS, June 6.—Zola who has returned to France is naturally overjoyed at the outcome of the Dreyfus revision proceedings, and in the course of an interview, said: "I knew the light was finally bound to break through the mass of falsehood, calumny and forgery and that Dreyfus would be restored to liberty and honor and myself no longer forced to live in exile." "Armed with the truth," said M. Zola, "I knew all must come right."
