LET'S EAT  
"Chicken Little" Stars At A Children's Party

Parties for the kindergarten set best planned in the late afternoon, so refreshments can take the form of supper at five-thirty. A young mother I know gave a Chicken Little party this spring for her five-year old twins, based on the book of that title that tots now and love. The group include eight children altogether.

Invitations of yellow double-folded paper, cut chicken-shaped. On the day of the party, each child first make a chicken head-piece so they could all become "Chicken Littles." The materials used were paper bags and colored plastic tape for the feathers and features.

Next came a hard-boiled egg hunt, followed by scenes acted out from the Chicken Little story, with the mother as producer. Then came supper, a fingerfood menu of cold broiled drumsticks, carrot sticks, celery curls, ripe olives, and bread and butter and peanut butter sandwiches. Dessert was ice cream, of course, and slices from the Chicken Little cake.

Chicken Little Cake: Make or buy a large sponge cake. Cover with yellow icing. Decorate the sides with ribbons of pale green icing put through a pastry tube. Top of the cake sit a cardboard cut-out.

To make it sit up straight, fasten the cut-out to a straw with cellophane tape, then stick the end of the straw into the cake. Edge the centerpiece with little chicks or decorated hard-cooked eggs sitting in paper souffle cups.

Broiled Drumsticks: Brush chicken drumsticks with lemon juice and melted butter. Dust with salt and a little paprika. Broil 7" from the heat for 15 min. until beginning to brown. Turn occasionally and baste with melted butter.

Continue to broil slowly about 10 min. longer or until fork-tender and well-browned all over.

GINGER SNAPS  
1/2 cups brown sugar  
1/2 cup shortening  
1 cup light colored molasses  
1 scant tbs. soda  
1 heaping tbs. ginger  
1/2 tbs. cinnamon  
1/2 tbs. nutmeg  
pinch salt  
2 eggs  
6 cups flour

Mix all ingredients together except eggs and flour and heat to boiling point. Remove from stove. When cold, add the well beaten eggs and flour enough to roll thin. Bake in 350 deg. F. oven on cookie sheet in desired shape.
