The evil spirit of the universe comes in the form of a glowing green sphere. We are led by him through a number of short sketches that demonstrate the hideous wonders of his evil.

When "good" arrives to avenge the villainy of "evil", however, things slow down considerably. The plot and action in these scenes leave one wondering if Rocket Robin and his Merry Band will come flying around the next mountain.

Despite its drawbacks, "Heavy Metal" is a movie worth seeing. Superb art work and music provide an eyeful and an earful as groups such as Journey, Cheap Trick, and Devo propel extravagant creatures and machines about the screen.
