Strait, Gulf Ice Condition Easing

The heavy band of ice, which prevailed in the Gulf of St. Lawrence, is melting fast and moving southward, leaving large areas of open water in Northumberland Strait permitting commercial ships to operate virtually unimpeded by icebreakers, it was learned yesterday from the district marine agent in Charlottetown.

The latest aerial survey shows that there is open water in the St. Lawrence River and along the south shore of Quebec, south of Anticosti Island, and along the east coast of New Brunswick from the Bay of Chaleur to Bouchette.

Four days of east wind could move heavy ice into this open water off New Brunswick, from where it could be carried into the Strait by the tide, making crossings by the CNR ferry MV Abegweit very difficult, it was learned from Provincial Director of Transportation, B. Graham Rogers.

Winds from the west or south-west are needed to clear all the ice completely, he said, while

HALIFAX (CP) — The weather office says a disturbance is expected to bring cloud into the district today. Intermittent rain should begin in the western sections of the Maritimes in the afternoon or evening and spread into the other regions by nightfall.

Present indications are that all regions may expect a few showers on Sunday with clearing taking place in New Brunswick later in the day.

Regional forecasts:

Halifax and vicinity: Sunny becoming cloudy in the afternoon; occasional rain or drizzle in the evening; a little milder; south winds 15, increasing in the afternoon to south 25. Low-high at Halifax 7 and 45.

Outlook for Sunday: A few showers.

South Shore and Annapolis Valley: Cloudy; Intermittent rain beginning in afternoon; south winds 15, increasing near noon to south 25. Low-high at Yarmouth 25 and 50, Kentville 23 and 50. Outlook for Sunday: a few showers.
