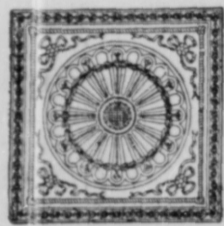

ISLAND HORSES.—Mr. Thomas Meagher has imported two fine horses from P. E. Island, one a four year old and the other six, for use on his delivery team.—Picou Standard.

DROWNED WHILE BATHING.—Basil Smith, a miner, was drowned at Springhill on Saturday last while bathing. A companion who was with him was unable to render any assistance.

IT'S IN NOVA SCOTIA.—The Digby Courier reports the arrival of the "kissing bug" in that town, a little girl having been stung on the lip and endured great suffering. This is about the first case reported in Nova Scotia.

THE BRIDGEPORT HORROR.—A Bridgeport despatch says: An investigation of the scene of the awful electric car accident shows marks of what was apparently a broken flange. The bridge appears to be all right. The theory advanced is that the motorman lost his head as the car shot down the incline approaching the bridge and the broken flange helped to bewilder him. He turned the current on instead of turning it off. A live witness agrees the car was going very fast.

INSANITY IN ENGLAND.—The report of the commissioners of lunacy, just published, points out that the actual increase of the insane of England and Wales during 1898 was 3,114, the largest yearly increase on record. The number of lunatics is readily arising from 1859, when it stood at 26,716, to the present time, when it has reached a total of 105,086. Experts believe that within an appreciable time the rate will have risen until one in every one thousand English people is shut up in an insane asylum.

CHRISTIAN ENDEAVOR.—The Maritime Province Christian Endeavor convention will be held in Sackville on Sept. 5th, 6th and 7th. The session will be held in the Methodist Church. The societies are composed of members of the Presbyterian, Congregational, Methodist, Baptist and Church of England bodies. There are in Nova Scotia, New Brunswick and Prince Edward Island 675 societies, the majority of which are in Nova Scotia. There will probably be about 250 delegates present. One session will be held at Fort Cumberland. Judge Morse is expected to deliver an historical address.
