The balance of fine jewelry, selling less than cost, at the Diamond Bookstore, 89 Queen Street. The International Steamship Company will build a 1,400 ton steamer to supply the place of the lost City of Portland.—Crisis Times. A FIFTEEN year old daughter of Mr. Philip White, of Washademoak, N.
