Late blight is active in potato fields throughout the Island. It can cause serious crop losses if allowed to run.

You can do three things that will help to protect your crop and prevent tuber rot.

1. **SPRAY or DUST**, regularly and thoroughly, with DITHANE or other effective fungicides.
2. **USE A TOP KILLER** when the plants are mature or when you decide to stop spraying.
3. **WAIT** two or more weeks before digging.

Nato Meeting Poses Problems

OTTAWA — This city's physical shortcomings as a world capital are bringing wrinkles of worry to the face of Herbert Moran as he lays plans for housing, feeding and entertaining some 500 people expected to attend the North Atlantic Treaty Organization Council meeting here.

Arrangements for the Nato meeting are the responsibility of this 43-year-old assistant Deputy Foreign Minister. They call into play all the experience he acquired as our army's director of organization for the Sicilian invasion, and later as Canadian colonel in charge of administration in Northwestern Europe.

For example, neither of Ottawa's two first class hotels is large enough to accommodate all the Nato people and news correspondents. Moran will have to split them into two groups — and he forsores bitter complaints.

The Conference opens Sept. 15 — which means the visitors, including up to 33 cabinet ministers of foreign countries — will be in Ottawa over the week-end. What to do to entertain them on Sunday is another Moran headache.

Most of the 12 Nato countries will send their Foreign, Defence and Finance ministers to the meeting — the first Council session since January and the first ever held in Canada. They and their scores of advisers will stay at the Chateau Laurier, which is being cleared for the occasion of all but permanent guests.

The council sessions will be held in the Parliament Building, behind closed doors — as Foreign Minister Pearson once quipped: "Open covenants secretly arrived at." But in reality there may be no firm decisions on important questions made at this four or five day meeting. Informed Ottawa sources anticipate that instead of exchanging views on mutual problems, with final decisions being postponed until the council meets in Rome in October.

No agenda has yet been prepared. But it's a safe bet that among the matters to be discussed will be the proposed admission of Greece and Turkey to the defensive union, how the Nato countries can increase their forces to counteract the Russian threats in Europe, and how the cost of maintaining a Nato army, navy and air force in the European area should be split among the Nato countries.

Delegates will converge on Ottawa by plane, ship and train from the capitals of the 11 other Nato countries, from United Nations headquarters at New York, and from the Japanese Peace Treaty conference at San Francisco. It will be the largest Nato meeting ever held, for never before has there been a joint session of

Foreign, Defence and Finance Ministers.

The Government will entertain the delegates at a reception, various embassies will entertain in honor of their ministers, and Ottawa's bars will be popular rendezvous for advisers and newspapermen. That is, except on Sunday. How to counteract the initial depression of an Ottawa Sunday is one of Moran's chief problems, for the Government, proud to be host, doesn't want its guests to return to Paris, London, Brussels, Rome and other centres of gracious living firmly determined never to agree to another meeting in Ottawa.

One suggestion was for Ottawa to seek special dispensation from Queen's Park to operate a cocktail lounge in the Parliament Building for the duration of the conference, including Sunday. But it won't. After the June 25 by-elections, the Government feels it's already sufficiently unpopular with the voters without risking the displeasure of the Temperance vote with a bar in Parliament.
