S.D.U. Basketball Team Meets Dalhousie Tonight In Exhibition Game

The Saint Dunstan's University crack basketball team plays Dalhousie University tonight at the Saint Dunstan's Alumni-Gymnasium in the first exhibition intercollegiate game to be played here this season. The game will start at 7:30.

The smooth working Saints have played three Island League games and a number of exhibition contests this year and have won all their games by wide margins. Tonight's game is expected to provide them with stiff competition as they prepare to enter regular Maritime Intercollegiate play.

The Dalhousie hoopsters are given a good rating in Intercollegiate circles. How the Saints make out against them tonight should give a fair indication of what the local Collegians can expect in Intercollegiate League games. Like last year the Saints will first enter the N.B.-P.E.I. Intercollegiate League in competition with Mount Allison, U.N.B. and St. Thomas. A year ago the Saints came within one point of winning the two-province crown and advancing to the Maritime finals against St. F. X. This year the Saints are regarded as a stronger team than they were a year ago. Their regular players are showing their old-time form in recent games while the addition of several new players has given the team added strength. Leading the Saints parade as usual is Jack Reardon, the talented Augusta, Maine, youngster who is almost beyond a doubt the best ball player who ever performed in this Province. In the three Island League games to date Reardon has scored 78 points, an average of 26 points a game. In two of those games he played little more than half the time. He scored 33 points in the only game that he saw nearly full-time service.

The Dalhousie players will likely be keeping a sharp eye on Reardon tonight and it should be interesting to see how well they can guard him. If they put two men on him one of the other Saints will be loose and anyone of them can run up quite a score.
