TO JAMES EDWARD SAMUEL BAGNALL, of Charlottetown, aforesaid, Gentleman; ELIZABETH CLARK, of Chicago, in the United States of America, widow of George Clark, late of Charlottetown aforesaid, deceased; The Reverend BENJAMIN SCOTT, of Onslow, in the Province of Nova Scotia, Baptist Minister, and CLEMENTINA SCOTT, his wife, being Heirs of the said Estate, and to all other Heirs, Statute Claimants, legal Representatives, and other parties interested in the said Estate—Greeting:

WHEREAS James Barrett Cooper, of Charlottetown, aforesaid, Esquire, the husband of Jane Cooper, one of the daughters of the said Intestate, and Daniel Hodgson, of Charlottetown, aforesaid, Esquire, the representative of William Bagnall, one of the sons of the said Intestate, have this day filed a Petition setting forth, that the said intestate died possessed of both Real and Personal property in the Island aforesaid, leaving a widow and five children him sorrowing; that upon a division of the said Real Property being made by consent among the said Heirs, three fourths part of town Lot Number six (6) in the first Hundred of Lots in Charlottetown, aforesaid, were duly set apart to Mrs. Charlotte Bagnall, the widow of the said intestate, as and for her right of Dower in the Real Estate of the said Intestate; that the said Charlotte Bagnall, widow as aforesaid, did depart this life in the month of October last past; and the said Petitioners did in and by the said Petition pray, that I might make such an order in the premises as would enable the Petitioners to receive the shares respectively belonging unto them, of the said three fourths part of the said Town Lot, a little more or less, with the appurtenances, in pursuance of the Statute in such case made and provided. *Now therefore I do hereby order*, that You, the said James Edward Samuel Bagnall, Elizabeth Clark, Benjamin Scott, and Clementina Scott, and each of you, in Person, or by your Proctor, and all other parties interested in the said Estate, do appear before me, at my Chambers, in the Colonial Building, in Charlottetown, aforesaid, on Thursday the 4th day of January next ensuing the date hereof, at noon of the same day, to shew cause, if you or they can, why the Division of the said three fourths part of said Town Lot, with the appurtenances should not be made by five capable persons, on oath, or by any three of them, that may be then and there appointed and sworn by me, among the said several Heirs at law of the said late Samuel Bagnall, deceased, or their legal representatives, according to law.

And I do hereby further order, that a true copy of this order be published in the *Royal Gazette*, newspaper, for at least three consecutive weeks from the date hereof; and also that a true copy of this order be forthwith served upon the Agent or Agents respectively of the said Elizabeth Clark, Benjamin Scott and Clementina Scott, his wife, such Agent or Agents being resident in the Island aforesaid; and that such publication in the said *Royal Gazette* newspaper, and such service upon the agent or agents as aforesaid shall be deemed a sufficient service and notice of such division as aforesaid upon the said persons respectively last named.
