## SITUATION IN CUBA.

Near Approaching Peace.

Probable End of War in February.

HAVANA, Jan. 29.—Captain General Blanco, it is announced from Spanish sources, at Mansoville, province of Santiago De Cuba, in addressing the municipality of that place, said that the country should look forward with confidence to the near approach of peace which he believed would be arrived at in February.

## SPAIN AND THE STATES.

A Peace Outlook—Reciprocity  
Assured.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 29.—Despatches from Madrid state that negotiations between the States and Spain are well along to completion, not only as to reciprocity but also as to peace.

It has been known for some time that reciprocity negotiations were in progress, and the State Department was advised by Minister Woodford several days ago that he had arranged for a commercial agreement to be concluded either at Madrid or Washington.

## LATEST NEWS BY WIRE AND MAIL.

HALIFAX, N. S., Jan. 26.—The visit to Ottawa of Hon. J. E. Baker of the Yarmouth Steamship Company seems to have been not without effect. A week ago notice was given by the D. A. R., cancelling all traffic arrangements with the Yarmouth company. Today the following telegram was received from Yarmouth: The D. A. R., has rescinded the order of the 18th. All ticket arrangements are the same as before. Through tickets are at all stations Wednesdays and Saturdays via, Yarmouth Steamship Company. From this it appears that the present traffic arrangements are to be continued.

TORONTO, Ont., Jan. 27.—The tenders for \$1,036,000 of 3-1-2 per cent bonds were opened yesterday by the city treasurer. The highest price offered was 107 1-2 for \$200,000. The highest for the whole bid was \$103,221-2. The best price previously obtained was \$97.06 in 1895. The issue was subscribed for thirteen times over.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 27.—All the advices received by the state and navy departments from Cuba yesterday were satisfactory. General Lee at two o'clock reported that all was quiet and order prevailed in Havana. At about the same hour a cablegram came to the navy department from Captain Sigbee of the Maine, saying that general interest was manifest on the arrival of the Maine in Havana Harbor, but there had been no demonstration. He had been ashore himself several times officially and had been received with the greatest courtesy. He expected to visit the palace to-morrow.

The information from Madrid by the Associated Press that the Spanish government had decided to send the warship Viscaya on a visit to American ports, caused no comments in official circles. She is a formidable craft, larger, faster and more powerful than the Maine.

OTTAWA, Jan. 27.—Attention has been drawn to a very common error in the use of the title "honorable" as applied to provincial Ministers. The title is theirs only during the time they hold office, but strangely enough the application of the title to them afterwards is strictly forbidden by the law which reads, "during their tenure of office and no longer." It is also pointed out that there is no legal propriety in affixing the title of "honorable" to the name of a judge. The London Gazette, in announcing the knighting of Chief Justice Burton, worded the announcement "George Burton, Esquire."
