Blind Piano Tuner Found in Excavation

Missing since 8 p.m. Friday Montague I. (Monty) Warren, 56-year-old blind Charlottetown pianotuner was back in his Great George Street home shortly after 8 a.m. Saturday.

Warren was discovered early Saturday morning by workmen on the Fathers of Confederation Memorial Building, in an open excavation on the Richmond Street side.

WIDESPREAD SEARCH

When found, he was missing his eye but was otherwise warmly clad. He tramped around most of the night to keep warm and pass the time until located.

During the night the temperature dropped to a chilly 23 degrees.

Sidewalk Clearance Act To Be Enforced

Street committee chairman Elmer MacRae said Saturday the matter of removal of snow from sidewalks has provided the most vexing problem for civic officials this winter.

He said the subject has come to the fore especially at this time, because Centennial Year is bringing great numbers of visitors to the city in the winter; to attend various conventions and other affairs.

Mr. MacRae called particular attention to the nearness of the Dominion Curling Championships, scheduled for the first week in March, and said a tremendous influx of curlers from all parts of Canada would start late next week. In addition, he pointed out, there will be countless officials in charge of the Brier matches, newspapermen from all over the country as well as radio and television crews on hand for the event.

Due to the tremendous amount of publicity the city will receive as a result of this event—expected to bring up to 1,000 people here—the streets chairman issued a special appeal to the citizens to accept responsibility for keeping sidewalks clear of snow.

He said, since a vast majority of the visitors will be here as pedestrians, it was especially desirable they receive a good impression of the city.

Marriage Course Set For St. Pius X

A 10-session course for married people in the fundamentals of marriage, begins at St. Pius X Church hall Parkdale Tuesday evening at 8 p.m.

This is the only such course scheduled for the Charlottetown area this year and couples from the city as well as several country parishes are expected to attend. This is the Parkdale parish's first in conducting the course, which was found to be successful in Charlottetown and St. John's.

Rev. Walter Reid, speaker for the first lesson will take as his topic "The Present Situation With Regard To Marriage." Religious, moral, spiritual and social adaptations will be dealt with by Rev. Preston Hammill next week.

Adapted and rewritten for married people from the longer course, preparation for marriage, this course looks at marriage from the aspects of love and happiness, economy, spirituality, relations and morality. It also covers masculine and feminine anatomy and psychology, and hygiene.

It has been emphasized that this course is beneficial to couples married for a number of years, as well as newly-weds.

Services were held yesterday at noon by members of the Charlottetown branch of the Royal Canadian Legion, in memory of those who died during the South African War, 1909-1901. The service was in remembrance of the Battle of Paardeberg.

Attending today's service was the South African branch of the Canadian Expeditionary Force which fought during the Boer War, 1899-1901, 83 years of age.
