Pressures May Be Easing On N. America Currencies

WASHINGTON (CP) - International pressures against North American currencies may be easing, shifting to those of Europe where production costs are rising.

This was the prediction today of Peter Jacobson, managing director of the International Monetary Fund, as he opened a five-day annual conference with a suggestion there is no need to change the present price of gold.

Of post-war monetary tensions, he said that a government might be considered to meet its currency exchange problem did not have to be harsh as might at first have been anticipated.

There would be no need to change the existing official price of gold, pegged at \$35 an ounce in U.S. funds, Jacobson said. There would be no need to build a system of "extensive liquidity" to meet the needs of the dollar against the pound, which Britain would like to see the United States formally guarantee in terms of gold equivalent. The U.S. is opposed to this and fund leaders strongly support the U.S. position.

Now, Jacobson noted, production prices in the U.S. appear to be stabilized while wages in several European countries are outpacing productivity with a consequent pressure on costs.

As the realization of these facts spreads in ever-widening circles, confidence in currencies is being confirmed by the evolution of the foreign exchange market.
