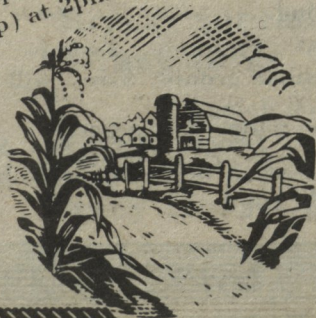

Various artists The Lost Boys Soundtrack

The soundtrack to the movie "The Lost Boys" has a wide variety of artists with songs on this LP. Included are INXS, Jimmy Barnes, Roger Daltrey, Echo and the Bunnymen, Lou Gramm, Gerard McMann, Tim Capello, Mummy Calls, and Thomas Newman.

The first song on the album is also the first one to be released. It's called "Good Times" and it's performed by INXS and Jimmy Barnes. The song is very good and it can be classified as likable. The second song, and to me the best one on the album is written and performed by Lou Gramm, yes the same Lou Gramm who was in Foreigner. The name of the song is "Lost In The Shadows (The Lost Boys)." Gramm's lyrics are powerful as is the music. Also the song has something to do with the movie. Many

soundtracks just get together a collection of music and call it a soundtrack without any of the songs having anything to do with the movie. The only weakness this song has is it's length, which is in the area of seven minutes. Roger Daltrey sings the next song called "Don't Let The Sun Go Down On Me". The song was written by Elton John. Unfortunately that is the only good thing about the song because it is a boring, slow tempo song. An adventure soundtrack is no place for a waltz like this. In fact the song sounds better in 45 rpm than it does in 33 rpm. The final song is performed by INXS and Jimmy Barnes, and is called "Laying Down The Law". The song is good but not great.

Echo and the Bunnymen have the first song on the second side of the album. It is an old Doors classic called "People Are Strange". Now I know why the Doors were so popular because this song is good

and Echo and the Bunnymen do an exceptional job of performing it. The theme song from the album is called "Crey Little Sister" performed by Gerard McMann. I think the song is too slow for an adventure show, there is no beat, and frankly the lyrics stink. I like the songs "Powerplay" performed by Eddie and the Tide and "I Still Believe" performed by Tim Capello. The last two songs on the album are "Beauty Has Her Way" performed by Mummy Calls and "To The Shock Of Most Lives". The last song is an instrumental (YAWN).

In conclusion the album is not really that bad as there are a couple of good songs on it. However there are also a few songs on the album that really stink. If you haven't noticed by now I'm a little indecisive about this album. I wouldn't run right out and buy one in case they sold out, but I also wouldn't say it would be a waste of money to buy it.
