HOUSEHOLD HINTS.

All towels should be thoroughly dried before they are put into the hamper.

The dirtiest frying pan will become clean if soaked in ammonia and water.

Spirits of turpentine is the thing with which to cleanse and brighten patent leather.

Head stains on wall paper may be blotted out by an application of a mixture of the soft parts of molding clay and water applied at night and brushed off with a whisk broom in the morning.

Figs that have become dried may be freshened by laying them upon a plate and placing the plate in a steamer until the fruit is softened and full. Roll the figs in confectioner's sugar and let them stand in a warm room awhile.

Mending China.
