Sealed tenders addressed to the Superintendent, Prince Edward Island National Park, Grand Tracade, Prince Edward Island, will be received up to noon on Monday December 8th 1958, for the privilege of operating as a concession for a period of five years the Dalvay House Hotel along with the two smaller buildings used for tourist accommodation. Tenders should be offered on the basis of the fixed annual rental the applicant is prepared to pay for the concession.

In submitting a tender the envelope enclosing the same should be endorsed: "Tender for Dalvay House Concession". Each tender must be accompanied by a deposit of not less than fifty dollars (\$50.00) in the form of an accepted cheque, a money order or a draft made payable to the Receiver General of Canada. Any tender in the amount of less than twelve hundred dollars (\$1200.00) annual rental will not be considered and the highest or any tender will not necessarily be accepted.

The concession consists of Dalvay House and two smaller cabins which accommodate a total of seventy (70) persons. It also includes kitchen and dining room facilities. The successful applicant will be required to furnish to the satisfaction of the Superintendent, the entire development including bedrooms, lounges, kitchen and dining room.

## Sees Growing Threat From Russian Industrial Might

QUEBEC (CP)—Canada should shed the complacency she is showing toward the rocketing manufacturing power of Russia, W. R. McLachlan of Toronto, executive vice-president of A. V. Roe Canada Limited, said Wednesday.

Mr. McLachlan spoke to delegates at the annual convention of the Air Industries and Transport Association which he led to Russia last summer as one of 30 Canadian businessmen.

"We tend to forget that there is a simple, single aim of communism—world domination," Mr. McLachlan said.

The Russian government had said it would dominate the world by outstripping the industrial power of the non-Communist nations.
