To Those Who Work Outdoors

By Herman N. Boudesse, M. D. Who wants to work on a very hot summer day? Almost nobody! Unfortunately, most of us have to.

Those lucky enough to work in air-conditioned offices or plants can probably maintain their usual efficiency, even on the hottest days. But for those who must perform physical labor outdoors, it is a different story.

It takes time for your body to adjust gradually to the heat. I suggest you take it easy, especially during the first two or three weeks of hot weather.

The worst weather for working outside is a day when the temperature is 100 or above, the humidity 75 per cent or more and there is no wind.
