CONTROL OF COUCH GRASS IS SOUGHT
Ottawa, — O a e fairly effective approach to couch grass control in eastern Canada involves a combined operation dealing with chemicals and cultural practices.
J. S. Leese of the Kentville Regional Station outlines a control program.
1. If the land is in arward, plow it in the fall.
2. The following spring, as 6 to 8 inches of new couch growth appears spray with Daldapon 12 pounds per 100 gallons of water. Use enough spray to thoroughly wet the grass.
3. After the tops of the grass have died, usually 2 to 3 weeks, disk the land thoroughly.
4. Follow with a field cultivator at 2-week intervals. These cultivations will kill any couch roots that survived the spray. The last cultivation should take place during the driest part of the summer.
5. In early September sow the land to a winter cereal, which can be plowed down the following spring prior to planting out. Couch grass will be suppressed sufficiently to allow growing annual crops following Step 3 but there will be considerably build-up during the growing season and the chemical by itself will not eliminate couch grass.
