Around The Armouries

This week "Around the Armouries" switches from -officers commanding to a padre for the lead article. He is Rev. J.R. McMahon, Protestant padre with the 5th Signals Regiment.

Rev. Mr. McMahon is a Church of England minister and at the present time has a parish in Alberton. Big, rugged, and ever-smiling, his pleasant friendliness belies a fighting reputation.

He got his first military training as a cadet at Halifax Academy and after leaving school went to the Halifax Rifles as boy signaller. He came up through the ranks in successive promotions to corporal, sergeant and C. Q. M. S. Later he was in the Dalhousie-Kings contingent C. O. T. C. and became an officer cadet.

In 1938 he was posted to the West Nova Scotia Regiment as assistant adjutant and weapon training officer. Just two years later he went on active service as 2nd Lieutenant R. C. A. S. C. In that unit he qualified as lieutenant in 1943 and the same year was named chaplain and variously posted to Kingston, Goose Bay and Halifax before going overseas. He was in Italy in 1944 with C. R. A. S. C. troops and then was posted to the R. C. R. where he served under Brigadier W. W. Reid in Northwest Europe. Rev. McMahon returned to Canada after VE Day to join the Far East force, but the Japanese war folded up and he went to Camp Borden as first post war padre of the R. C. D. and Lord Strathcona Horse. He returned to civilian life and acted as padre in Fredericton, N.B., for a time while awaiting a parish. He joined the Sigs here in June of last year.

Born in Halifax in 1916, Rev. Mr. McMahon received his education in schools there and later at Dalhousie University and Kings where he got his B.A. degree in 1938 and in theology two years later. He has served as curate at Liv-

erpool and was rector at Milton, P. E. I. at the time he went into the Army.

Since the end of the war he has served at St. Martins in the Chatter-Mahone Bay area from which post he resigned due to a war disability. A long stretch in Camp Hill followed and then on his recovery he held a parish at Windsor and taught at Kings Collegiate School. He came to Alberton two years ago. He is married to the former Marguerite Jane Spanner of Toronto, and they have four children.

GRAIN

WINNIPEG, April 3 — (CP) — Oats futures today reflected export business in that commodity by moving higher in all contract months during trading today on the Winnipeg Grain Exchange. Both barley and flax posted declines while rye had some minor gains.

Trading was dull and the commercial demand was light except for the export business. Processors and local houses showed interest in flax while American accounts entered rye. Barley had routine shipper demand.

Overnight export loadings report-

include 630,000 bushels of wheat to the United Kingdom; 500,000 bushels to Eire; and 70,000 bushels to India. There were also reports of an undisclosed quantity of oats to Holland and an unknown amount of barley to the continent.

Class two and international wheat agreement prices both moved one-quarter cent higher.
