CITIZENS PLAY ROLE

Fifth Islander Will Be Chosen

Letters of nomination for the 1963 Islander of the Year award are now being accepted as citizens of the province are once again being given an opportunity to play a major role in selecting the award winner.

The Evening Patriot announced Monday it will once again sponsor the award established in 1959 through which some 15 islanders are honored and tribute paid to good citizenship.

Four winners have been named since 1959. They are Lt. Col. W. E. Johnstone, Burlington, 1959; Capt. Carl P. Burke, Charlottetown, 1960; Dr. Frank MacKinnon, Charlottetown, 1961 and Dr. Eric M. Found, Charlottetown, 1962.

Actual choice on the Islander of the Year will be made by a panel of three judges to be named at a later date. However, letters of nomination play a vital role in influencing their decision.

Such letters should be no longer than 300 words giving the name of the person suggested as Islander of the Year and the reasons why he or she should be seriously considered by the judges.

Letters should be sent to the Islander of the Year Editor, The Evening Patriot, Charlottetown, no later than noon of Wednesday, Jan. 8.

The Evening Patriot takes no part in the selection of the Islander of the Year other than suggesting as a term of reference to the judges that the award should go "to that person who used the best means available in 1963 to serve a worthy island purpose."

Visibility Is Cut By Ground Drift

SUMMERSIDE—High winds in the Eastern Prince County area last night were causing heavy ground drift and in some areas visibility on the highway was almost nil.

At 9 p.m. winds were blowing west at 25 to 30 miles per hour with occasional gusts to 40 and were expected to remain at that velocity overnight.

A dispatcher for one company said that plows had been taken out and would remain until winds diminish. They would, however, venture out in case of an emergency. Visibility was reported extremely poor on the highway west of Summerside, he said.

Another dispatcher said two of his company's plows were still out on the highway but he expected them back shortly. The plows had worked most of the day clearing the main highways and secondary roads.

An RCMP forecaster said last night that six inches of snow had fallen yesterday, setting a new December record of 34.3 inches for Prince County. This scattered the mark of 34.1 inches set in 1955.

The mercury rose to a high of 24 yesterday morning while the snow was falling but as the day wore on the temperature took a big drop. At 9 p.m. it stood at five above and was expected to dip to between two and four below before morning.

MAINLY SUNNY

The forecast for today is "mainly sunny with a few clouds below freezing from five to seven above." The Mercury could possibly drop as low as 10 degrees below zero tonight, the forecaster said.
