"FOR MEN ONLY", TIMELY FILM AT CAPITOL, S'SIDE

The dynamic story pits a university scientist against authorities in a single-handed fight to abolish fraternity hazing, after brutal treatment of a freshman leads to the youth's accidental death and involves the college in a scandal. Woven into the campus drama is the triangle in which the scientist and his wife separate under pressure of the situation, and he is fired under accusation of having an affair with an attractive coed. Henreid's performance is up to the high standards he has set as leading player in a dozen top movies, and the featured cast, hand-picked by the producer-director-actor, responds with uniformly able portrayals. Margaret Field is excellent as Henreid's wife, Kathleen Hughes scores as the predatory coed, and Vera Miles registers dramatically as girl-friend of the ill-fated fraternity pledge. Robert Sherman makes an auspicious bow in the latter role. Russell Johnson is a believable football hero, the heavy of the film, and James Dobson as a hapless frosh. Other key roles are handled by Douglas Kennedy, as the college president, and Robert Carson, a district attorney.
