Woman Editor From Formosa Tours Canada On UN Fellowship

SASKATOON, (CP)—A member of the national Legislature Yuan—the legislature of National China on Formosa—is touring Canada on a United Nations fellowship to study Canada's welfare program.

Mrs. Yen Fu, editor of two magazines in Taiwan, capital of Formosa, was in Saskatoon recently to attend the fourth biennial western regional conference on social work.

Mrs. Yen Fu said the first thing she will do when she returns will be to draft legislation to protect children.

She is in Canada to study orphanages, family services, federal and provincial budgets for child welfare, and the training and appointment of personnel.

Child welfare is a big field in China, said Mrs. Yen Fu. There are no laws to protect children.

She has been in charge of homes for orphans and the aged since 1934, at one time in Nanking. She was principal of a nursery school for refugee children at Chungking and from 1949 to 1951 headed an orphanage at Taiwan.

Mrs. Yen Fu was also professor of psychology, personnel administration and municipal government at the National Lan Chow University from 1949 to 1951.

This is not her first visit to North America. She went to Seattle in 1939 to study at the University of Washington and later attended the University of California at Berkeley, Calif.

Mrs. Yen is a widow with two daughters. The eldest girl is attending college in the United States and the other is at school at Ottawa.

National Y.W.C.A. Convention Opens In Quebec Today

QUEBEC, (CP)—The Young Women's Christian Association may study the "serious problems" facing young married women who are highly trained in business or professional fields.

In an address prepared for today's opening sessions of the national convention being held here, Mrs. J. L. Savage of Toronto, national president of the YWCA, said "alarming figures were released in the United States as to the number of frustrated, nervous wrecks found among this group."

Mrs. Savage said these girls suddenly find themselves immersed in cleaning, cooking, marketing and eventually "baby chasing" for none of which they are prepared.

"As one third of our membership of some 45,000 is married, it is necessary to study their special needs in program planning."

YWCA Membership

Phyllis Haslam, personal secretary of the YWCA national council, reported that two-thirds of the membership is Protestant, the other being composed largely of the Roman Catholics, with some of the Jewish, Greek Orthodox and Greek Catholic faiths.

"The largest proportion of the YW membership is in the 16 to 20 age group," she said, "with office workers forming the greater part of the membership in large centres, then home makers, high school students and professional workers."

In a summary of activities since the last convention in 1949, Agnes Roy, national executive director of the YWCA, said that rural clubs had increased.

"There are 17 of these clubs with

an enrolment of 850," she said.

Recreation Programs

Miss Roy said of the 58 YWCA's, joint YW-YWCA's and branches, 48 had recreation programs. She reported 30 associations owning gyms, 14 owning swimming pools, five renting gyms and 12 renting pools.

"There are two associations building gyms and two building pools," she said.

The director noted that there had been increasing co-operation on

the part of boards of education which enabled the "Y" to increase service to public and high schools. Miss Roy said it was hoped that a specialist in residence work and food service would be added to the national staff.

"There are 58 associations and branches of the YWCA," she said, "39 with residence, 37 of which have food services."

During the inter-convention period four new associations of the YWCA were formed in Cobourg and Port Hope, Ont.; Lethbridge, Alta. and New Westminster, B.C.
