ALEX SCOTT IS NEVER IDLE

Retired Engineer Believes In Work

CHARLOTTETOWN (Special) — Alex Scott of Charlottetown, as spry a septuagenarian as ever, is a man who centres a paradox. He's retired but he won't stop working.

Ten years ago, at 66, he stepped out of the Canadian National Railways engineering department after a 35-year career. In a matter of months he was back in business. He's still going strong.

If there is one thing Mr. Scott cannot abide it's inactivity. Loafing, he says, would be the death of him. "I would have died if I hadn't been working," he said yesterday in an interview.

NO RUSTING Even a cursory examination of Mr. Scott's enterprise during the last decade floodlights the fact he has been in no danger of rusting away from inactivity.

Between the ages of 65 and 75 the Scottish-born alumnus of Edinburgh University has been bouncing around construction jobs like an undergraduate engineer at the senior prom.

Right now he's building a highway bridge in Prince Edward Island. Since 1950 he has bossed university, schools, hospitals and road construction projects.

(Continued from page 1) He appealed then to heads of government, saying: "We pray for the heads of states, joined with us in recognizing that their high calling establishes them not as judges but as guides of the nations; to these they are in duty bound to guarantee respect for the fundamental rights of the human person."

The Pope added: "We offer a prayer that peace, the daughter of gentleness and goodwill, may establish a lasting rule among the nations made over anxious by the clouds which repeatedly darken the horizon."

In Sunday's address, Pope John cried: "Oh Jesus, victor over death, we Catholics of Rome and of all the world pray to you above all for peace."

"At all times there exist somewhere or other threats that cause anxiety."

"So now there are light and fleecy clouds, questions and problems which appear, disappear and reappear and which could represent danger for harmony and good understanding among peoples."

Speaking of the devil, whom Christ called the prince of this world, the Pope said: "Gently but efficaciously Christ conducts the struggle against him in order to obtain the affirmation of justice and the triumph of peace."

"The infernal adversary hates justice and opposes peace within peoples and in the whole world. Sometimes his attacks, his manoeuvres, create such confusion as to lure those who defend themselves against him to give way to weakness."

FAITH IN CHRIST "Every good Christian places his faith in Christ: Accomplishes his duty in accordance with the rules which govern his conscience—his religious conscience, his civil conscience, in the face of God, in the face of men."

"The Christian does not give way and does not compromise. He goes ahead, brave and sure of himself. He co-operates in the problems of peace."

(Continued from Page 1) ation I would see our financial agreement with the federal government brought to a successful conclusion and the province secure so that I might make this a good time to drop out of politics."

"But," he added, "the loggers' strike and the handling of financial assistance from the federal government means that I am stuck."

"I certainly will stay and see it through."

Mr. Smallwood said his "highest ambitions" for the past two or three years had been to quit and return to writing. He said such a move now would mean "deserting my job and Newfoundland."

PERSONAL GRUDGE He said Mr. Diefenbaker probably bore him a grudge because of the premier's successful opposition in the last federal election. Liberals won five of Newfoundland's seven seats.

"If Mr. Diefenbaker is punishing Newfoundland because of my successful opposition, then I am willing to remove myself from the scene."

Mr. Smallwood is the author of six books and plans to write at least five others, including one on the inside story of Confederation.

Mr. Smallwood called a period of mourning in Newfoundland after the prime minister announced Wednesday there would be no further financial commitments to Newfoundland after March 31, 1962. On Thursday the premier told the Newfoundland people the province's fight was against Mr. Diefenbaker — not Canada and the people of Canada.

Mr. Smallwood said he did not have the desire to lead his people out of Confederation, but the mood of the people at this time was in the direction of secession.
