Enmore Man Dies At 79

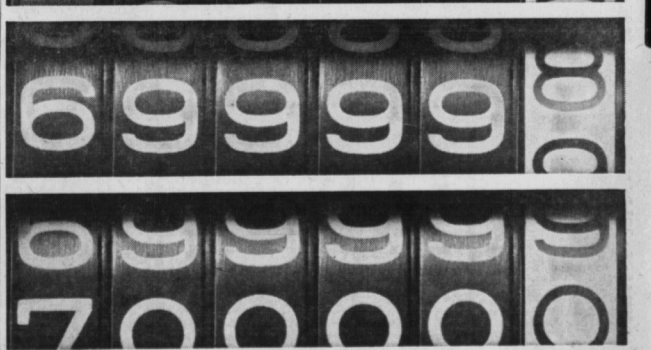
SUMMERVILLE - The death of Major Noye, 79, of Enmore, occurred Friday evening June 8, in the Prince County Hospital.
