Sees Prospect For Improved Potato Price

Prospects for a somewhat better price for Island potatoes later in the season were forecast last night by Mr. Leo McIsaac, local representative of a Toronto brokerage firm.

This prediction is based Mr. McIsaac said on the fact that speculative buying delivery is very heavy at the present time, indicating that a substantial number of such buyers force a better price later on.

"The movement of Island tablestock is at present heavy, but not above normal for the time of year," he said, adding that, in direct contrast, the demand for seed was "very dull."

Cobler seed, in particular, he said, is expected to be in short supply. The reason for this serious lack of demand for Cobler seed was attributed by Mr. McIsaac to the fact that the principal purchasers of this variety, at this time of the year, the growers of Southern Ontario, have had a very poor crop of this variety and are in no position, financially or storage-wise, to take in seed the present time.

Buyers consider that in due course there will be considerable of the newer types of seed, such as Kennebec, moved to outlets in the United States and over to Mr. McIsaac added.
