Magistrate's Court

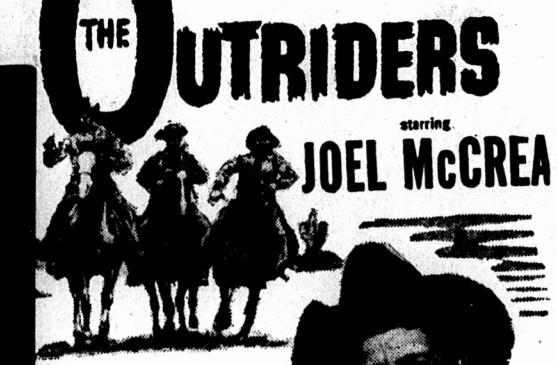
Stipendiary Magistrate for King's County, Joseph W. MacDonald, K. C., held court in the Court House in Georgetown on Thursday, June 7th at 10:00 a. m. The first case involved a Murray River resident, charged under section 36(2) of the Prince Edward Island Temperance Act. A fine of \$20.00 and costs was given. A resident of Montague was fined \$25.00 and costs for an infraction of section 222B of the Criminal Code. A resident of Murray River charged under section 44(B) of the Highway Traffic Act, for failing to stop at a stop sign, was fined \$15.00 and costs. A resident of Belle River charged under section 222B of the Criminal Code and also under section 36(2) of the Temperance Act, had a fine of \$16.00 imposed under one charge and a fine of \$20.00 on costs under the other charge. A resident of Heatherdale charged under section 36(1) of the Temperance Act, was fined \$20.00 and costs. The final case involved a Surgeon resident, charged under section 29(2) of the Temperance Act, had a fine of \$25.00 and costs imposed. Court adjourned for one week.

Teachers' Study Group At Souris High School

Approximately thirty enthusiastic teachers from various districts in Inspecorate Six assembled at Souris High School for the semi-annual study group.

Miss Helen Foley, by appointment, carried out duties of chairman and Mary Keays acted as secretary. Mr. Harold I. Hynes, supervisor of the Inspecorate was present.

A previously prepared agenda for Study Groups proved most helpful to teachers.

Considerable discussion took place concerning promotion of pupils from Grade eight to Grade nine, who have failed to attain required pass mark in Group Achievement Tests for Grade eight. Incidentally, it was suggested that this pass mark be raised to at least 150. However, it was unanimously decided that the matter of promotion be left to the discretion of the teacher.

The bulk of opinion regarding the high percentage of unsuccessful 1950 entrance candidates favoured the following apparent facts: (1) Unpreparedness of candidates to write examinations finalising Grade ten requirements, and, (2) inability of candidates to read question papers of various subjects intelligently and comprehensively.

It was also considered that mentally retarded pupils be given an opportunity to develop some hobby or talent which would give them a suitable place in society. Mr. Hynes stressed the importance of carefulness of teachers in completing enrolment forms, attendance reports, monthly and annual returns. He pointed out that a certain degree of inaccuracy in doing this had been displayed by a few teachers.

Other topics which received discussions were, improvement in school buildings; property; furnishings and equipment; assistance from Department of Education in the form of grants for new schools; renovation and equipment, also library grants. Following this, the meeting adjourned.
