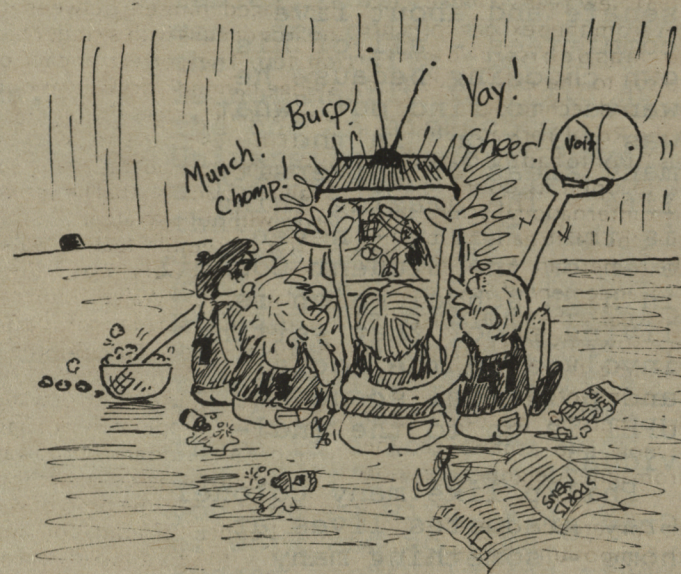

Listed below are just a few of the many things that Robertson Library has to offer:

- personal study carrels that you may reserve at the beginning of each semester - at the circulation desk in the library. They are great places to study and to keep personal belongings but get there early for they are in high demand.
- non-reserved study carrels (both smoking and non-smoking) that serve as a place for those people who visit the library less frequently and just want a temporary place to study

- group rooms are available for those who are working on a group project and need to discuss their work
- personal study rooms
- a typing room (typewriter provided)
- large reference section and P.E.I. collection consisting of materials relating specifically to P.E.I.

- materials on microfilm, microfiche, films records, and all the equipment needed to use them (also an Audio-visual department that contains everything from tape recorders to video-tape machines)
- * an extremely helpful staff that will go to any lengths to help students find materials and who will give individuals or groups tours through the library to find out where everything is
