SUPREME COURT.

TUESDAY, NOV. 2.
The Michaelmas term of the Supreme Court opened at 11 a. m. There were present, the Chief Justice, Mr. Justice Hodgson, and Mr. Justice Fitzgerald.

John Ryan vs. Patrick Ryan and another. An application to set aside judgment entered upon against defendants in personal capacity in a suit against them as executors. W. S. Stewart Q. C., for applicant's. A four days rule granted.

Massey Harris Co. (Ltd) vs. John E. Hill and others.—Tried October term, 1897, before Mr. Justice Fitzgerald. Judgment of nonsuit. The Court, on application of M. McLeod, Q. C., granted a rule nisi to set aside nonsuit.

Donald Gillis vs. Martin Martin.—Action of trespass, tried Trinity term. Verdict for plaintiff. On motion of H. C. McDonald, Attorney General, the Court grants a rule nisi for a new trial on the ground that the verdict was against the evidence.

Richard E. Johnston was today called to the bar.
Wm. E. Bentley was admitted an attorney and appointed a commissioner for taking affidavits in the Supreme Court.

Henry W. Turner vs. Benjamin Rogers, jr.—This was an action for the price of a horse and harness alleged to have been sold and delivered by the plaintiff to the defendant, and was tried before the Chief Justice without a jury at Summerside when judgment was reserved. The defence was that the horse had not been sold, and even if he was, that the plaintiff was not the owner.

Stewart, Q. C., for plaintiff; McLean, Q. C., for the defendant.
The Court stands adjourned until tomorrow at eleven o'clock.
