Israeli Reports New Arms Source

TEL AVIV (AP)—Israeli Premier Levi Eshkol said here his country has "new, most important sources for weapons." He did not identify them.

He said Israel is reserving its right for freedom of action if the status quo in the neighboring state of Jordan should change.

He was apparently referring to the recent decision of the Arab-Jordanian council to move Jordanian troops into Jordan. But he reiterated in principle Israel's desire to respect existing frontiers.

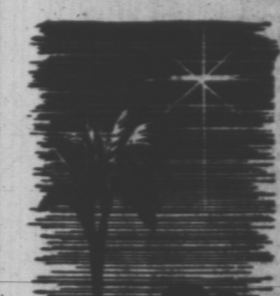

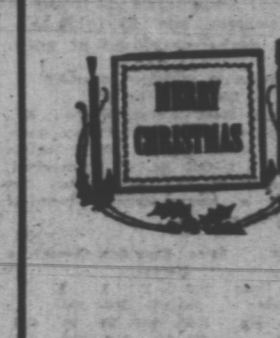
