CONTRACT BRIDGE

The bidding: North East South West 1 1 1 2 1 1 1 2 1 1 1 2 1 1 1 2

Opening lead—ten of spades. This interesting hand came up in a national championship event some years ago. As usual, there were all kinds of results at the many tables where the hand was played. Final contracts ranged from a game to a grand slam in spades or diamonds with the North-South cards, and from five to seven hearts doubled with the East-West hands.

The opening leads chosen by the West players varied considerably also. In many cases, a heart was opened in response to East's overall. Where this happened, dummy's jack was played, forcing the ace, and the slam was made with ease.

Some of the Wests opened the singleton diamond; others felt it was best to attack the club suit. Our story concerns itself with a table where the bidding took place as shown and West's opening lead was the ten of spades. Here the declarer had a job on his hands to take six, not having the advantage of a heart lead.

After taking three rounds of trumps, the ace and king of diamonds were led and declarer discovered, to his great annoyance, that the diamond suit was blocked, and that he could not run the suit to discard a losing club, on dummy's fifth diamond.

The prospect of losing two club tricks and the slam did not appeal to this particular declarer any more than it would to anyone else. Undismayed by the failure of the diamond to break 2-2, which would have simplified matters, South considered his problem and came up with an ingenious play which guaranteed the contract.

He led the jack of hearts from dummy. East playing low and on it discarded a diamond. Although he lost a heart trick unnecessary, South gained in exchange two tricks.

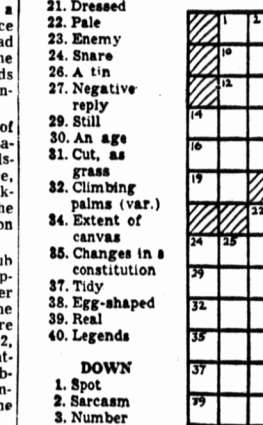
