Harold Douglas has entered the Charlottetown Hospital for treatment following a severe heart attack last week. Mr. Douglas was removed to the hospital on Thursday evening and as we write this, his condition is very grave and his wife is remaining near his bedside.

Mrs. Vincent McGrath was a business visitor to the city last week along with Mr. and Mrs. James Kennelick and Mr. and Mrs. Gordon Hooper. That reminds us that Mrs. Hooper was one of the school teachers in the Old Harbour School here some 30 years ago. As a girl she was Mamie McKinnon at that time and a good teacher at that.

Last week it was announced that a young Catholic priest in Western Canada was consecrated a Bishop at the age of 39 and was considered Canada's youngest east BC Bishop. The older people here will recall the late archbishop Sinnott who was consecrated archbishop of Winnipeg many years ago at the early age of 27 as the youngest archbishop in Canada. The archbishop's old home is here and he attended the old Harbor School as a bare footed boy and some of that old class are still around Bristol.

The old home still is called Snookley Farms despite the fact the mighty house once built for a seaside hotel has been remodelled and cut down to residential size.

During the archbishop's time many high church officials vacationed at the mansion house with his great many years ago. Mrs. James A. O'Brien, now in her 80's says she remembers the archbishop as a boy called Alfred Sinnott in her school days and some years before his death he was made a count of the holy family in Rome and made a final visit to the old home shortly before his death some years ago.

Two weeks ago we mentioned the price of dry cod fish in the city at 85 cents per pound and some called poorer grade at 30 cents. Checking with the fishermen we are informed by Frank Kelly a well-known fisherman they got three cents for some last summer and later four cents per pound at the shore dressed. Quite a difference.

Mrs. Walter Munroe, Medford, Mass., arrived home last week called by the serious illness of her sister, Miss Marjorie Findley, who has been a resident in the Sacred Heart Home since last summer following a severe illness.

Mrs. Munroe was Lottie Findley in single life and left Bristol more than 30 years ago. Her husband died some years ago and another sister, Mrs. Katie MacDonald, resides in Bristol. Mrs. Munroe will stay there most of her time while home.

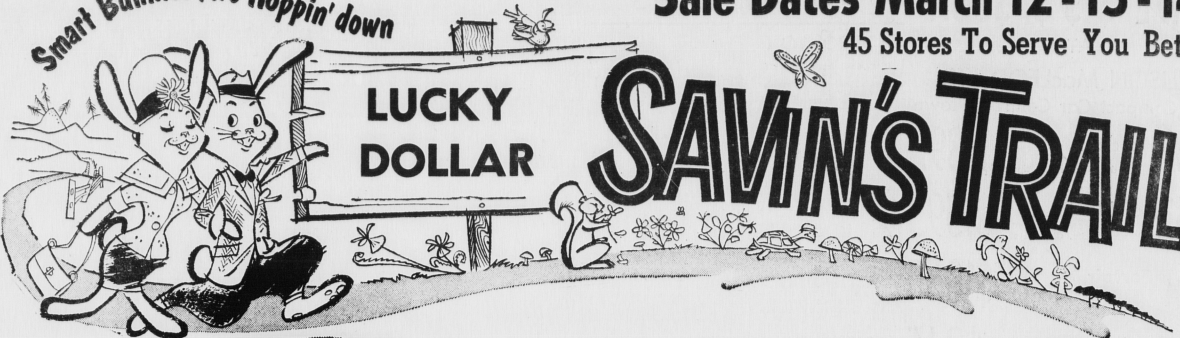

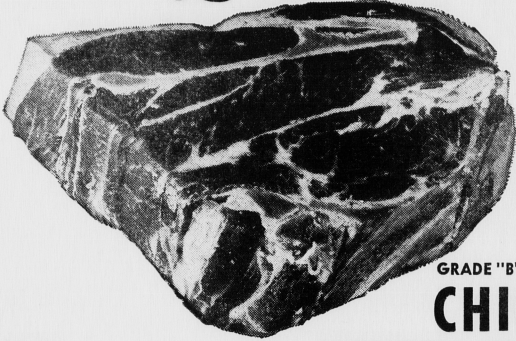

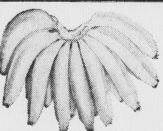
