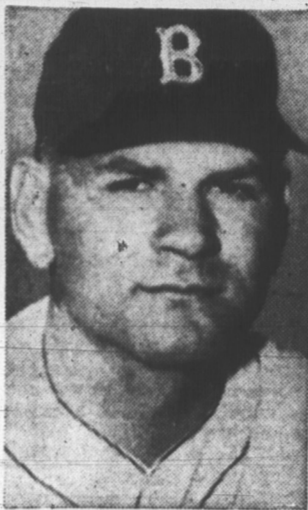

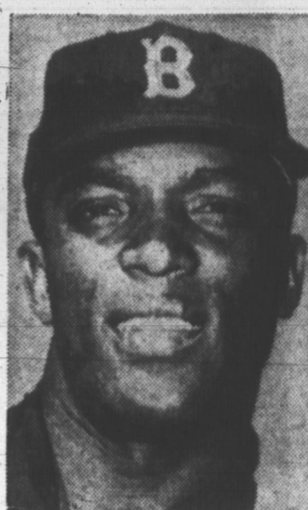
The Ladies Institute organised a supper to get enough funds to pay for the jackets and all members of the team, were presented with one.

NEW YORK (AP)—Pitchers are the hottest item on the market in the flurry of action before baseball's June 15 trade deadline with such big names as Earl Wilson, Eddie Fisher, Dick Radatz, John Wyatt and Fred Talbot involved in deals.

After midnight Wednesday no deals can be made unless waivers have been obtained in the league. The waiver price is only \$20,000.

Detroit moved to bolster its pitching staff Tuesday by acquiring Earl Wilson, a regular starter with a 5-5 record, from Boston Red Sox.

Leaf Coach Punch Imlach Finds Loophole In Rules

MONTREAL (CP)—George (Punch) Imlach, Toronto Maple Leaf's astute general manager, apparently found a way Tuesday to hold on to suspended all-star defenceman Carl Brewer and still protect 18 other players for today's NHL internal draft.

Imlach requested that he be allowed to transfer Brewer from the Leaf's reserve list to the Toronto inactive list under an NHL bylaw governing players attending university.

Clarence Campbell, NHL president, said the move is legal and that Brewer's name does not have to appear on the list of 18 players to be protected by the Leafs and that the defenceman cannot be drafted by any other club.

Habs Trade Berenson

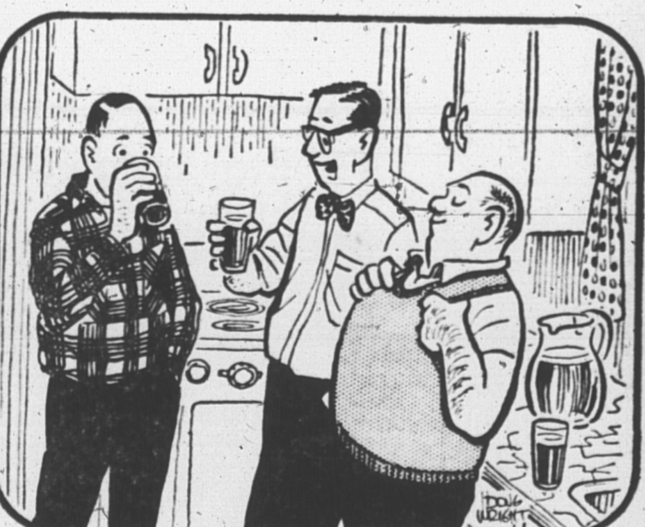
MONTREAL (CP)—Montreal Canadiens and New York Rangers completed a two-for-one deal Tuesday in the first trade of the four-day annual meeting.
